Norma Talmadge in "Granstark"

What a lovely creature Norma Talmadge is! There is refinement about her dark beauty and gracious gentleness in her deportment that fit exactly the embodiment of the Princess Yelive, in "Granstark." The story is complete and as believable as any fairy story and the setting is admirable in every respect. Miss Talmadge is more like the Norma of four or five years ago than she has been recently. One sees Miss Talmadge in many guises—simply dressed as the incognito princess traveling in America; non in the gorgeous robes of royalty; and once more as a bride. "Granstark" places the young American and gives a fine performance of the role, playing with a good deal of sincerity. Marc McDermott is cast for the evil genius of the tale, Prince Gabriel. He manages to make himself thoroughly hated as does Roy d'Arcy as Dangloss, henchman of the prince. Wanda Hawley is pretty and competent as the confident of the princess, and others equally importantly cast are Frank Currier, Lillian Lawrence, Albert Gran, Winter Hall and Michael Vavitch.
