RADIO OPERATORS DECLARE A STRIKE ON ENGLISH SHIPS

LONDON, Nov. 27.—(A.P.)—The strike of the wireless operators on British vessels which was called yesterday, threatening to seriously affect shipping in the course of a few days. The strike was ordered as a protest against a proposed cut in the salaries of the operators of about \$5 per month. Although some 5000 members of the Wireless Telegraphist union are involved in the strike, cessation of work, if there is no settlement of the dispute, will be gradual, as it is understood existing contracts will not be broken and the men who signed for voyages before November 26, will fulfill their engagements. No further contracts by the operators are to be signed however, and it is estimated that six hundred of them will leave their posts before the end of the present week.

Gus Newbury Offers a Plan. To the Editor: I listened with very much interest to the Oregon land grant discussion at the Crater meeting last evening, and it seems to me as though the argument advanced by Mr. Gore was entirely sound and the history of the situation as presented by him must have been indeed a revelation to most of the people who were there assembled; and certainly the government should make some provision for the reimbursement to Jackson county and other counties for the losses which these counties sustained because of the cancellation of the contract which the government had with the Oregon-California Railroad company, but this, it seems to me, does not solve the whole difficulty. Even though we should be reimbursed for the losses which we have sustained because of our tax situation, the lands would still not be upon the tax roll for future assessment and for future revenue to the various counties in which these lands are situated.
