ST. MARK'S CHURCH TO BE CONSECRATED HERE THIS SUNDAY

Sunday will be a great day for the members and friends of St. Mark's Episcopal church, as on that day the Rt. Rev. Walter Taylor Sumner, D. D., bishop of Oregon, will in the solemn and joyous ritual of the church consecrate and set aside from all secular uses the beautiful church, built nine years ago.

According to the law and usage of the church, no church building may be consecrated while any debt remains unpaid on it. By a united effort the last remaining obligation has just been met and the church is now free from debt.

On Sunday the bishop, vested in cope and mitre, having his pastoral staff borne before him, will enter the front door of the church and, advancing up the aisle with the choir, will enter the chancel and proceed with the impressive service of consecration.

Since the coming of the present vicar, St. Mark's congregation has made a steady and continuous growth. Beginning at that time with no assets, they now have a beautiful church, an up-to-date parish house and a comfortable rectory, the only debt being a small amount still due on the parish house.

A boy choir, the first in the state, has been organized and a pipe organ to be installed within the coming year are further activities and aspirations of the congregation.

The members and friends of the church are invited to be present at the consecration service on Sunday, as well as at the informal reception to the bishop to be held at the parish house on Saturday evening.

LARGE CROWD AT CHURCH SERVICE

The union Thanksgiving service at the Presbyterian church was the best ever held in the city. Nearly every pastor of the various churches of the city had a part in the service, rendering it in a most impressive way. The quartet added joy and praise to the festive occasion. Rev. D. J. Howe of the First Christian church preached the sermon. His message not only touched upon the many blessings which our nation has enjoyed, but in his subject of "The World's Imperative Need" he struck the note of a universalism even though there be personal Savior which would render all people's more able to offer praise and thanksgiving for their present good estate.

The attendance was large, in fact the largest at any union Thanksgiving service. The offering was also the largest, being \$36.07. This goes to the Children's Farm Home at Corvallis.

It is hoped this joyful spirit of praise and Thanksgiving will continue among our people.

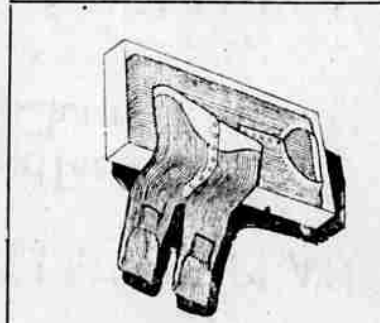
