

# TEARS FLOW AS LAST RITES TO QUEEN ARE PAID

### Funeral of Dowager Queen Alexandra Is An Affecting Spectacle — Queen Mary Breaks Down at Bier—Sobs Heard Along Line of March.

LONDON, Nov. 27.—(A.P.)—Winter, reaching out an icy hand laid a tribute on the bier of the gentle Alexandra, England's queen mother today, covering her casket with a fleecy blanket of snow as it was trundled on a gun carriage from the Chapel Royal in St. James palace to Westminster Abbey, where the simplest of funeral services was held.

Thus the sea king's daughter departed from the capital of her adopted empire as she had entered it, for the snow was also falling on that distant day 62 years ago when she came from Denmark to be the bride of Edward VII. Close behind the casket, walking along with bowed head, came her son, the king of England, muffled in the great coat and wearing the plumed hat of field marshal, which also received a coating of the white flakes before the procession had gone far.

Ahead behind this solitary figure came the monarchs of Belgium, Norway and Denmark and back of the Prince of Wales and his brothers and the crown princes of Rumania, Sweden and Denmark, Norway and Belgium, with Lord Lascelles and other nobles who have married into the royal family.

Under gray coats these royal figures wore the dress uniforms of the ranks they held either in the army or navy of Great Britain. But of the uniforms only the gold braided hats relieved the austere shades of the funeral procession. There was but a single other spot of color—Alexandra's only royal standard, with which the casket was draped.

Handkerchiefs found the eyes of many and sobs were heard in the ranks of the many who had waited for hours in the cold and wet, for among them were some who had seen Alexandra pass up and down the same streets under clearer skies and under happier circumstances.

Soft music to the cadence of which the procession moved, was stopped as the procession reached the abbey and the coffin was carried into the darkened building on the broad shoulders of eight guardsmen who placed it upon a catafalque before the high altar.

In the abbey waiting the arrival of the procession was Queen Mary, dressed in deep mourning, her face covered by a heavy veil and around her the queens of Spain, Norway and Belgium, Princess Mary, the Duchess of York and several scores of relatives.

The queen and her party had driven directly from the palace, arriving more than half an hour before the funeral procession. Queen Mary was visibly affected throughout the service. She raised her handkerchief to her eyes when the casket was brought into the abbey and several times found it impossible to continue in the singing of the hymns.

The archbishop of Canterbury read the service and the quiet funeral rites were read with "God Save the King."

The king left his place, followed by the queen and other royalty, to the strains of Chopin's funeral march and after their withdrawal the congregation departed silently, leaving the casket on the catafalque. As the building was emptied the sun suddenly shone for a time, its rays streaming down upon the bier.

At 1 p. m. the doors of the abbey were again opened and long processions began of those desirous of paying tribute to the dead queen for the last time.

The coffin after remaining in the abbey all of tonight, will be carried tomorrow morning to Windsor for burial in the private royal chapel.

# NEW GRAND STAND TO BE PAID FOR BY GAME RECEIPTS

In response to a communication from the high school, the school board, at its meeting Wednesday night, agreed to advance funds necessary to build the grand stand on the new Holly street athletic field, construction of which commenced yesterday. The agreement was made with the understanding that the board would be in full control and that the cost of building be paid out of the receipts of same until full settlement has been made.

Two bids for the erection were offered. Harry Turner was awarded the contract on his bid of \$1296, under that of H. E. Eifer at \$1560. The contractor has bonded himself to have the stand completed by noon, December 5, the date of the Salem-Medford football game.

The board, constituting itself as a supervisory committee, has made arrangements for a portion of the seats to be reserved for out of town fans and has allowed these prospective seat buyers until next Friday to purchase same.

The Jackson County Health association, represented by Dr. V. S. Gearey and Mrs. Alice Holloway, was also granted permission by the board to sell Christmas seals in the elementary schools of the city. Each student, it is understood, will be allowed to purchase as many as he desires.
