

NEW SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOL FOR DEAF IS DULY APPOINTED

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 27.—The state board of control today elected J. Lyman Slead of Philadelphia as superintendent of the Oregon school for the deaf. He will arrive in January and succeed O. L. McIntyre, resigned, who left Thanksgiving day for Council Bluffs, Iowa, where he will be superintendent of the Iowa State deaf school.

C., and has taken many special courses and had a wide experience. He has the college degrees of bachelor of letters, bachelor of pedagogy and master of arts.

Mr. Slead will receive \$1500 a year and his wife \$720 a year with residence and living costs furnished by the state.

Mr. Lindstrom of Salem, a graduate of the Oregon school for the deaf, is acting superintendent pending the arrival of Mr. Slead.

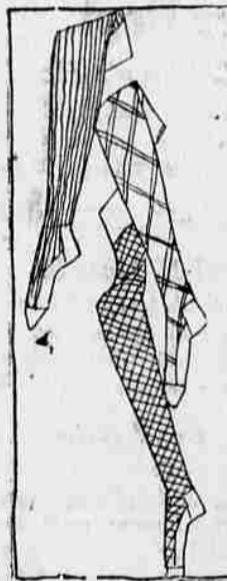
