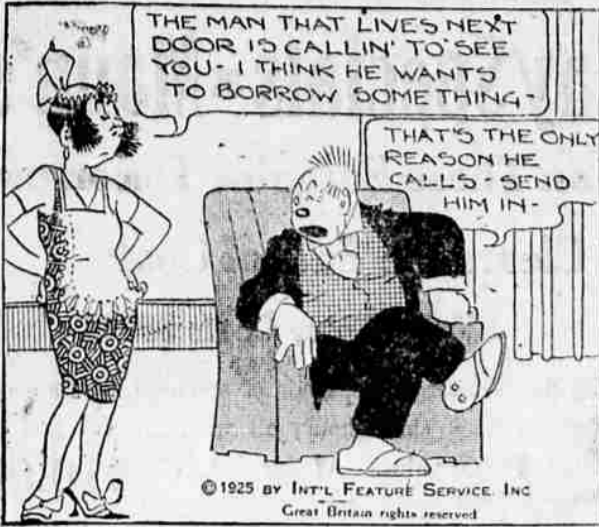

NEW NATIONAL PARK NEAR KLAMATH FALLS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30.—(A. P.)—A new national monument in northern California to be known as the Lava Bed national monument was created today by executive order of President Coolidge.

The region was the scene of warfare between whites and Indians in 1875. It contains fantastic examples of nature's handiwork in lava and has never been completely explored. It is approximately 65 miles by automobile from Astoria, Ore., and 45 miles from Klamath Falls, Ore.
