SEATTLE, Dec. 3.—(A.P.)—An official invitation has been extended to an eastern team to meet a western contender in the annual east-west football game in the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, New Year's day, Jack Ewen, Oregon manager, informed Dar-  
 win Melness, University of Washington graduate manager, in a telegram received here last night.  
 The eastern team has the same eligibility rules as Washington, is a conference power and will prove a drawing card for the game. Benefiel's telegram said, although the name of the team was not mentioned, if the eastern aggregation accepts the invitation, University of Washington players will consider representing the west, Melness said.
