Work on the Medford pipe line has begun in this section. There is a crew of about 30 men being employed in the work at present.

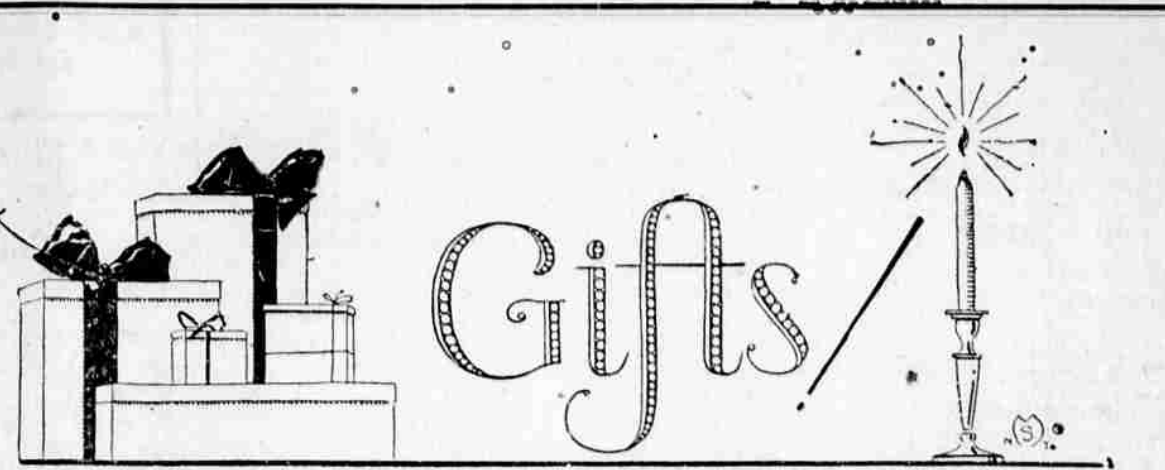
George Holmes is having a fence built around his property near the Antelope cemetery. He has two men staying on the place at the present.

The recent rains have greatly improved the looks of the winter wheat in this section.

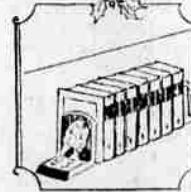
