ROSEBURG STORE IS ROBBED, THEN FIRE IS STARTED

ROSEBURG, Ore., Dec. 7.—A tailoring shop owned by J. H. Bernier was badly damaged late last night by a fire started to cover up a robbery. Thieves broke down the rear door of the building and with an auger bored holes around the locks of intervening doors so that they could reach the front part of the building, where they stole five suits of clothes and nineteen suit lengths of bolt goods.
Boxes of trimmings, kindling and papers were then piled up in two parts of the frame building and a fire started. Fortunately, however, the blaze was quickly discovered and extinguished before any great amount of damage was done.
Trunks found in the alley way in the rear of the building indicated that there had been two automobiles backed up to the shop. A few minutes before the fire two cars were seen to come out of the alleyway and go south at a rapid rate of speed.
Officers are today investigating a report that two men stopped at a roadside stand yesterday and endeavored to sell suit goods. It is possible, Sheriff Starmer says, that the theft and fire were the work of thieves who have been committing a series of like crimes.
