PRISON REPORT TELLS OF SANDEFER'S RUN

The report of the governor's prison investigating committee, appointed following the prison break last August, contains one paragraph of local interest, because it relates to S. B. Sandefer, former Jackson county prohibition enforcement officer, whose tactics and expenditures created considerable adverse comment during his three years' tenure of office.

Today's move took the form of a conference with businessmen. They were invited here by the governor to discuss the situation. Although Mr. Pinchot kept silent before the meeting as to the exact program he had in mind, he said its purpose was "in the interests of settling the strike without an increased cost of coal to the public."

Washington, Dec. 8.—(A. P.)—The payment of construction charges on federal reclamation projects would be extended over a period of 35 years under the provisions of a bill introduced in the senate today by Chairman Jones of the commerce committee.

The governor made clear his intention of sticking to the proposals which he presented as a basis for settlement on November 28 and which were accepted by the miners and rejected by the operators.

The road to Oakridge will cost more than \$500,000, Lane county offering \$250,000 co-operation. The entire session this afternoon was devoted to a conference with the local federal road and forest authorities in discussing the government's road work in Oregon in 1926.
