SCION OF WEALTH GIVEN LIFE TERM, GETS A PAROLE

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—(A.P.)—Ira Perry, Jr., son of wealthy parents, given a life sentence in prison in April, 1922, for murder in a holdup, has been released from the Joliet penitentiary on parole, it was disclosed today.

Police officials and prosecutors who said Perry had confessed to the murders and about 60 holdups which netted some \$200,000, said they had received no notice of the parole which was made effective October 31. The victims in the robberies were jewelers. Perry pleaded guilty.

A plea for leniency before the sentencing judge brought a life term instead of death. The parole board first commuted the judge's sentence to the equivalent of a manslaughter conviction, word from Springfield said.
