HUSKY ROUGHNESS NOT MENTIONED AT CONFERENCE

SEATTLE, Dec. 11.—(A. P.)—Not least, it was said here today, is to be heard in the Pacific coast intercollegiate athletic conference meeting in Seattle to adjourn tomorrow, concerning charges by President Williams of Stanford University that the University of Washington played illegally rough football this autumn against Stanford and the University of California.

Washington, it was learned, was prepared to offer many constructive suggestions dealing with selection and control of officials for athletic contests.

Delegates from California, Stanford and the University of Southern California arrived today.

A problem before the opening session is that five teams in three eliminations have bid for a football game in Portland October 3. The combinations were University of Oregon against Washington; Oregon Aggies against the University of Montana and O. A. C. against Washington State college.

Some delegates expressed a desire to bar competition between collegiate institutions and such organizations as the Olympic Athletic club, San Francisco; the Multnomah Athletic club, Portland; and the West Seattle Athletic club, Seattle.

Several organizations forming in Los Angeles would be affected.

Men in the Pacific northwest intercollegiate conference, meeting simultaneously, were discussing basketball schedules and officials.

DEMPSEY'S FIGHT WITH WILLS NEAR FINANCIAL ROCKS

CHICAGO, Dec. 11.—(A. P.)—Financial storm clouds are gathering over the proposed bout for the heavyweight boxing title between Champion Jack Dempsey and Challenger Harry Wills, giant negro, set for South Bend some time next year.

Willingness of the South Bend syndicate to post the substantial forfeit required in the contract obtained last summer by Floyd Fitzsimmons, Michigan City, Ind., promoter, may result in the withdrawal of the backer.

A new set of financiers, a new promoter, perhaps Tex Rickard, and a new site for the bout will be discussed in Los Angeles next week at a conference of Dempsey, Fitzsimmons and Ray Canon, legal adviser to the champion.

Wills' Thirty Acres in New Jersey may be the battlefield.

Rickard says it is all news to him. He dropped out of the case when Dempsey split with Jack Kearns, former manager, with whom Rickard had an agreement that Dempsey would fight for no other promoter.

The champion, in Los Angeles, admitting that the contract with Fitzsimmons had been broken, is not exactly concerned. He understands that another offer may be made to him. The president of the Chicago syndicate will come to Los Angeles next week.

If Fitzsimmons meets the requirements of a proposed contract no other promoter has a chance, it is said.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 11.—(A. P.)—The proposed heavyweight championship match between Jack Dempsey and Harry Wills, negro, will "in all likelihood" be held near Chicago some time in July, Ray Cannon, attorney for Dempsey, told the Associated Press here today.

PAUL BERLENBACH SLIGHT FAVORITE IN TONIGHT'S BOUT

NEW YORK, Dec. 11.—(A. P.)—Paul Berlenbach, of Astoria, N. Y., light-heavyweight champion of the world, faces the greatest test he ever has known when he meets Jack Delaney of Bridgeport, Conn., tonight in the Madison Square ring, the first championship contest in the new sport arena.

More than twenty thousand persons are expected to attend this engagement scheduled for fifteen rounds to a decision.

Delaney knocked out Berlenbach in four rounds at the old garden in May, 1924. The Astoria champion is a much improved boxer. When he met Delaney the power of his fists was great but he had not developed a method of defense against the sharp-shooting tactics of the Bridgeport man. Delaney stands straight, at times dropping his arms to his sides, and carrying him off of his feet.

Fighting followers are divided to their respective but Berlenbach appears to be a much favorite. The men will meet at 8:30 about 10:00 p.m. standard time.

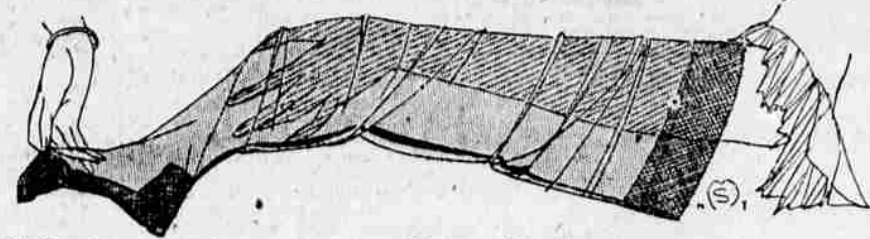

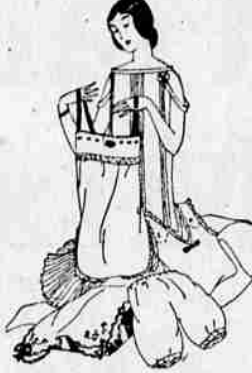
