

MARINES START FINAL OFFENSE AGAINST REBELS

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Mar. 14.—(P)—American marines today were under orders of their commander to make stringent efforts to wipe out the Sandino revolt.

For weeks supplies have been running steadily into northern Nicaragua where General Lindero has been active, by airplane, motor truck, pack train and oxen were used.

Today observers pointed to the memorandum of General Feland to his command as an explanation for the movement of supplies and munitions.

General Feland urged untiring effort in the immediate future in order that the task of the marines might be completed in the shortest possible time.

In May the rainy season begins, making made impossible seas of mud and fighting in the jungle difficult except for those who are used to it, such the followers of Sandino.

Fifty bluejackets from the cruiser Denver landed to take the place of marines being moved northward.

SENATOR WALSH TO BE OREGON CANDIDATE

WASHINGTON, March 14.—(P)—Senator Walsh of Montana today agreed to permit the filing of his name in the Oregon presidential primary race of May 18 for delegates to the democratic national convention.

This puts the Montana senator, who had the support of William G. McAdoo four years ago, in the primary contests of four states—California, South Dakota and Wisconsin. Friends are urging him to enter other primaries still open and he is understood to be favorably considering that development.

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MISS MILLER IS NOW READY FOR WEDDING RITE

NASIK, India, Mar. 14.—(P)—Doctor Gosave, one of those actively engaged in preparing for the wedding of Miss Nancy Ann Miller of Seattle to Tokaji Rao, former Maharajah of Indore, on Saturday, has received two letters threatening his life. The letters, which were anonymous, however, were not followed by an untoward incident.

Shankaracharya, the priest who performed the rites initiating Miss Miller into Hinduism was told by several Hindus that he had imparted fresh stimuli to the progressive forces of the religion.

Signing heretic Sasmistha, her adopted Hindu name, Miss Miller called her mother, Mrs. Jennie Miller, who is in Seattle, telling of her conversion. The cablegram read:

"You will be glad to hear that the conversion ceremony went off wonderfully well. Twenty-five thousand people attended. A wonderful night. Marriage fixed for evening of the seventeenth. We all send our love to you, grandma and Ruthie."

Miss Miller's grandmother, who is with her, also signed the message.

LINDY'S MOTHER ACCEPTS GIFTS

DETROIT, Mar. 14.—(P)—Madame Germaine Dosselle of Valenciennes, France, who here three weeks ago to present gifts from the people of northern France to Mrs. Evangeline L. Lindbergh, prepared today to leave for home, happy that her mission had been accomplished.

The gifts were presented yesterday at an informal ceremony at a high school here, where Mrs. Lindbergh, mother of Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh, is a teacher.

A book of signed messages from French people, a tapestry depicting the Statue of Liberty and the Eiffel tower flanking Colonel Lindbergh's portrait and a marble bust of the aviator were the gifts presented.

New Record Made in Death Flight Is Not Allowed

LONDON, March 14.—(P)—Flight Lieutenant S. M. Kinkaid, killed when his powerful speed plane plunged into the sea several days ago, attained a speed of 330 miles an hour along the straight near Southampton, the day before he crashed, said an official who watched the test flight.

This speed which would far exceed that attained by Major Mario de Bernardi, Italian flier who established a world record of 294.94 miles an hour, cannot stand as a new record, as it was not subject to official timing.

BOSTON, Mar. 14.—(P)—The state supreme court in an opinion for the house of representatives, ruled today that an initiative petition for a referendum on the eighteenth amendment was unconstitutional.

Additional troops would have to be transported by rail from Egypt to Palestine and thence by motor to Mesopotamia.

LIVESTOCK LOAN CONCERN FAILS AT SALT LAKE

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Mar. 14.—(P)—Alleged to be the federal intermediate credit bank, Spokane to be in arrears \$145,000 in payments to the bank, the Western Livestock Loan company, a Salt Lake corporation, has been thrown into receivership.

On the bank's petition, District Judge Ritchie yesterday appointed the Bankers' Trust company receiver for the loan company, which claiming insufficient notice, did not contest the action.

The bank in its petition charged that the loan company, with no legal right to do so, had collected more than \$185,000 livestock growers' partial or complete payment or notes held by the bank. The loan company failed to turn this money over to the bank and repeated efforts to collect the money have failed, the petition alleged.

3 CHILDREN DIE IN BLAZING HOME

NEWCASTLE, Wyo., Mar. 14.—(P)—Three small children were burned to death early this morning, the mother and injured man are expected to die and three other children escaped with minor burns when fire destroyed the home of William Slegner here.

WITNESS CHANGES FIRST TESTIMONY

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 14.—(P)—Myron Hooge, one of the witnesses against Clarence Brazell, on trial on a morals charge, today altered his previous testimony and declared that a confession he had made was given under duress.

The prosecution was depending upon Hooge's testimony to corroborate the testimony of another witness. As a result of Hooge's allegation that he was threatened by Burns detectives, the alleged confession, except for two paragraphs, was kept from the court records.
