

13 AUTO ACCIDENTS IN PORTLAND ALONE OVER THE WEEK-END

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 26.—(AP)—Thirteen were injured, one woman perhaps fatally, half a score narrowly escaped being hurt and three persons were arrested as the result of traffic accidents yesterday and early today in and near Portland.

Mrs. George F. Watson, 66, McMinnville, Ore., was received at the Portland sanatorium yesterday suffering from possible internal injuries, a broken collar bone and an injured spine after an automobile in which she had been riding had crashed into a machine said to have been operated by United States Senator Robert N. Stanford.

Miss Alice Becker, a passenger with Mrs. Watson, suffered minor cuts and bruises.

Hospital attendants reported to police that both women were carried into the hospital by a man driving the name of Senator Robert N. Stanford, who said he was the driver of one of the cars involved. Mrs. Watson's condition was described today as critical.

Motriest's Trial Starts EUGENE, Ore., Mar. 22.—(AP)—Trial of Charles Murray, Eugene, shoe man, charged with involuntary manslaughter for the death of William L. Martin in an automobile accident, opened this morning in circuit court. Judge G. F. Skipp was presiding.
