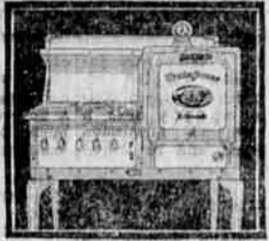

LIQUOR PARTY ENDS IN DEATH AT SAN PEDRO

SAN PEDRO, Calif., March 27.—Two bodies tentatively identified as those of George Conner, 25, of Long Beach, and Mrs. Conner, 49, of San Pedro, were found early today in the back seat of a touring car parked on the beach at White Point, by San Pedro policemen patrolling the district in search of rum runners.

The bodies were in the back seat of a touring car and in a position indicating murder and suicide, the police state.

The man, identified through cards which corresponded with the registration certificate of the automobile, clasped a .32 caliber revolver of Italian make in his right hand. The woman was shot through the back, the bullet penetrating her heart, and the man was shot through the temple.

Police state that the couple had been dead about two hours when their bodies were discovered. A large bottle partly filled with wine and a number of sandwiches were found in the machine.

Deputy sheriffs are attempting to solve the double tragedy.

ANNUAL BANQUET OF SPORTSMEN AT ASHLAND, APRIL 11

The Jackson County Game Protective association will hold its annual meeting and banquet at 7:30 p. m. Wednesday, April 11th, 1928, in the Elks temple, Ashland, Oregon.

The Oregon State Game Protective association has accepted our invitation to hold a joint meeting with us at that time. That not only assures a big turnout locally, but a big representation of sportsmen and those interested in game affairs from all parts of the state.

We plan to make this the greatest gathering of sportsmen that has ever been held in Oregon. The State Game and Fish commissions have accepted our invitation and we have sent invitations to 75 game organizations in the state and to about 100 prominent sportsmen and public men. The responses that we have already received indicate that we are going to have a notable gathering.

This is the first time the annual meeting and banquet of the Jackson County Game Protective association has been held in Ashland. Heretofore, they have always been held at the Hotel Medford.

There will be a discussion of many subjects interesting not only to sportsmen, but to all citizens of southern Oregon. This meeting will have the distinction of being the only game meeting ever held in the state where the members of the state game commission and the Oregon state fish commission have sat around the same table in harmony and good will and with but one purpose in mind, and that is to conserve and perpetuate the great game and fish resources of the state of Oregon.

The Ashland chamber of commerce will have in charge the ticket selling campaign for Ashland and the southern part of the county. The Medford chamber of commerce will take charge of the sale of tickets for Medford and the north half of the county.

We are expected to take a delegation of at least 200 sportsmen, game conservationists and business men to the meeting at Ashland on the night of April 11th. Tickets will be on sale with Ted Baker at the Chamber of Commerce, and we urge all who wish to attend this meeting to buy tickets early so we will know in advance of the date how large a crowd we will have to take care of.

LITTLE HOPE OF TAKING SANDINO

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Mar. 27.—(AP)—With the rainy season a little more than a month off making jungle lighting difficult, the belief is growing among American marines that Augustino Sandino, the rebel leader, can elude them indefinitely.

The only hope that they see of eliminating Sandino is that bombs dropped from an airplane might wipe out his camp. This possibility is admittedly slim, because of Sandino's frequent movements and the efforts made to conceal his headquarters.

Sergeant Edward F. Rowe of Malden, Mass., was wounded very slightly in the left arm at Condosa when a rebel slipped out of the jungle, fired at him and vanished.

MRS. COOLIDGE WINS; MOTHER IMPROVING NORTHAMPTON, Mass., Mar. 27.—(AP)—Mrs. Grace Goodhue Coolidge, wife of the president, spent half an hour at the bedside of her aged mother, Mrs. Lenira Goodhue, early today, after a hasty trip from Washington.

She had been summoned in the belief that Mrs. Goodhue's long illness had reached a critical stage and she might not live for more than a few hours, but when Mrs. Coolidge arrived it was to hear the cheering news that her mother had rallied.

It was Mrs. Coolidge's third visit here within as many months. She was accompanied by Lieutenant-commander Joel T. Boone, the White House physician.

GIRL INJURED IN MOTOR ACCIDENT IS NEW WATER CHAMPION

CHICAGO, Mar. 27.—(AP)—Sixteen-year-old Jane Fauntz of the Illinois Women's Athletic club, who many critics were certain would never regain her stroke because of an automobile accident last summer, today held two new world's swimming records.

Leading the I. W. A. C. to an easy 45 to 16 triumph over the Canadian champions, the Parkdale Dolphins of Toronto, last night Miss Fauntz shattered the international records in the 100-yard and 100-meter breast stroke. In addition, the I. W. A. C. relay team established a new mark in the 140-yard relay, a teammate, Violet Martin, broke the national mark in the 40 yards back stroke, and Walter Lauter, Lakeshore Athletic club, Chicago, who swam in a special event, excelled his own two-year-old national record in the 300-yard medley event.



OREGON STARTS WAR ON LIQUOR AND GAMBLING

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 27.—(AP)—War upon alcohol, gambling and reaction has been declared by General Alvaro Obregon, sole candidate for the presidency.

In a campaign speech at Silao, Guanajuato, yesterday, he denounced these as enemies of the Mexican people. "Reaction is our principal enemy; alcohol is its most formidable ally; cards are the ally of all the enemies of morality," he said.

General Obregon also denounced what he termed "wicked Catholics" who used their religion as a means of propagating rebel activities. "It may be necessary," he added, "to spill a little more blood in order to eliminate the last small nuclei of these evil ones, these false Catholics who would make of their religion a banner for fraternal strife."
