The fundamentals of the old time faith are taught and preached, and all seek to exalt this as the word of God. Nearly every adult member of the Bible school, and many of the younger folks carry, and are learning the book of books. Bible study is emphasized in every department.

Three week day prayer meetings are held each week besides the Sunday services.

The church has a very adequate building, especially good for a small place, which is used to its capacity in the Bible school and young people's work. Fourteen classes find themselves crowded, though there are eleven rooms available. There are three departments of the young people's work. The older group have just taken the initiative in finishing the basement rooms, which will be pleasing to all when they meet on Thursday evening.

Special meetings are planned for just one week, beginning next Sunday, the first, and closing with the celebration of the resurrection, on the 31st. The sermon on next Sunday morning will be preached specially to the leaders of the church; an elder will be ordained, and a consecration service held for all leaders present.

At 2:30 in the afternoon the Business Men's Gospel Team from Medford will hold a great service, and there will be evangelistic services in the evening. Only the evening service will be held on Monday; but beginning on Tuesday morning at 11 o'clock, there will be given a series of studies on Personal Evangelism; and in the afternoons there will be group prayer meetings held in various places of the town and community. These evangelistic services will be held each evening except Saturday evening. We are all welcome! We invite your cooperation and fellowship.

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EASTERN TOURISTS ON PICKWICK LINE STATE BANK TO VISIT VALLEY

M. S. Wren, eastern manager of the Pickwick stages, spent yesterday in Medford making arrangements for summer tourist travel which will bring a large number of eastern and middle western tourists to Medford and the Rogue River valley over this line.

By June 1, Mr. Wren expects to start his first parlor coach this way from eastern points with at least 20 people. From then on, he hopes to maintain a daily schedule. The route will leave extreme eastern points and stop at different places of interest en route. Three days will be spent in Los Angeles, one in Santa Barbara, two in San Francisco. The tourists will stop over night on the Redwoods highway, leaving next day for Eureka, and from there to the Oregon caves, where they will again stop over night.

They will leave the Oregon caves for Salem and stop over night at the new Hotel Senator, proceed north as far as Vancouver, B. C., and take the boat back to Seattle, where they will be taken to Portland by plane. Going up the Columbia highway, they will hit the Dalles, Bend and Klamath Falls, where they will stop over night and then go to Crater Lake and from there to Medford and take the inland route east.

Similar excursions will be planned going east at a later date. These excursions, according to Mr. Wren, include stopovers, hotel bills, and such features as boat and airplane rides in the district.

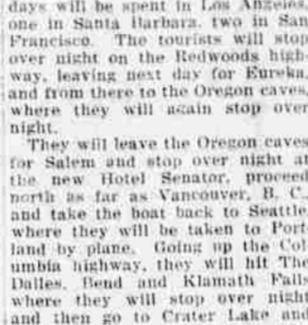

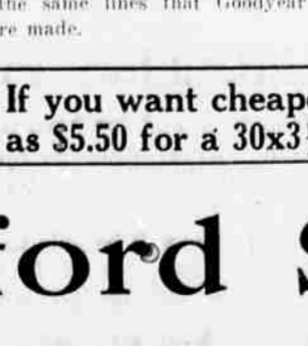
