

### POULTRYMEN OF VALLEY DISCUSS PACKING PLANT

At a meeting of the poultrymen of Josephine county tonight at Grants Pass the action taken may help insure the establishing of a packing plant in Roseburg by the Pacific Co-operative Poultry Producers if 104,000 laying hens are signed up tributary to the plant, which territory would take in Jackson and Josephine counties. It is understood that already 70,000 hens are signed up and if the Rogue River valley poultrymen decide to join in, there will be a sufficient number to guarantee the plant.

J. E. Judy, president of the Rogue Valley association, County Agent R. G. Fowler of Jackson county and County Agent H. B. Howell of Josephine county were named at a meeting of the board of directors of the valley association, held in Medford this week, as a committee to meet in Portland soon with the board of the Pacific association on this matter.

R. E. Cully, secretary of the Roseburg chamber of commerce and Monroe Nance, one of Douglas county's leading poultrymen, spent a few days in Jackson and Josephine counties this week relative to signing up poultrymen of the valley to market their eggs thru the proposed Roseburg packing plant.
