Wash Woolens Quickly. Woolen clothing should never be presoaked, and should be washed as quickly as possible. Take warm water about the usual temperature, as hot water shrinks wool fibers and stiffens the material. Make a good suds with a piece mild soap. Then dip the garment into the suds and squeeze the water through and through it with the hands. A wooden mangle should not be pulled, nor have soap suds directly against it.
