MILLIONS LOST IN STANDARD OIL FIRE AT HAVANA

HAVANA, Apr. 6.—(AP)—Fire raged today in the Standard Oil company's \$15,000,000 refinery at Regla, across the harbor from Havana.

Four explosions occurred within an hour after the fire was discovered at 10 o'clock last night, and frequent blasts occurred after midnight, although none were of sufficient force to cause added damage.

Inhabitants were driven out of the suburbs as the flames spread over a wide area surrounding the homes of the oil company officials. The officials held little hope that much would be saved in the storage area of the refinery, although a large force of fire fighters was on hand.

Two hundred men from the United States battleship Wyoming were sent to Regla, to aid in fighting the blaze. Twelve of these were later brought into the temporary Red Cross relief station established there, suffering from minor burns and exhaustion.

The Havana fire department also went to the refinery.

The people fled from their homes and were taken aboard the Wyoming and the Cuban battleship Cuba. A few of the women of the American colony remained at the scene to help the refugees so long that it was feared that their lives were in danger. They managed to escape, however, in the launches of the Wyoming which ferried the refugees across the harbor.

The blaze raged for seven hours before Havana fire fighters and men from the Cuban warship and the Wyoming made headway against it and this morning it was still beyond control in three of the 195 tanks of crude oil. Fourteen tanks were destroyed at the refinery which was known as the Beloit oil refinery of the Standard Oil company of Cuba, a subsidiary of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey.

C. M. Greenfield, assistant superintendent, said that loss would probably amount to \$2,000,000.

One Cuban workman was seriously hurt and 20 persons, including the 12 sailors from the Wyoming, burned.

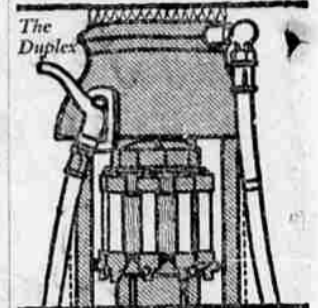

She stated she was accompanied on her swim by many Spanish witnesses. She will leave for England this afternoon.

WASHINGTON, April 6.—(AP)—Arthur H. Vandenburg, publisher of the Grand Rapids Herald, took the oath of office today as senator from Michigan, succeeding the late Woodbridge N. Ferris.

With the administering of the oath, the Republican membership was increased to 48, with the Democratic membership remaining at 44.

Casualties of the Air Service

SAN ANTONIO, Texas, April 6.—(AP) Cadet Clair E. Bonner, of Portland, Ore., son of an army chaplain, was killed here today when his plane crashed six miles from town.

Inspection of the wreck led officers to believe that Bonner was killed by the crash and not by the flames which burned his body long after the fall.

MONEY WORRIES SUICIDE CAUSE

SALEM, Ore., Apr. 6.—(AP)—O. K. Middleton, 52, real estate broker here, committed suicide early today, placing the muzzle of a 22-caliber rifle in his mouth and pulling the trigger. The suicide took place in the garage at his home.
