

PENNSY KLUXERS LOSE APPEAL TO FEDERAL COURT

PITTSBURGH, Pa., April 11.—(AP)—A counter action of five ousted Ku Klux Klansmen seeking a receivership for the order in Pennsylvania was thrown out of federal court here this afternoon by Federal Judge W. H. S. Thomson.

Judge Thomson interrupted arguments to hand his opinion from the bench. He held the federal court was without jurisdiction and that the question of a receivership and accounting for money collected in Pennsylvania by the klans was a matter for the state courts.

Charges that Imperial Wizard Hiram Evans of the Ku Klux Klan used klans money to foster murder, riots, arson and other acts of violence were made in court by Van H. Harrickman, attorney for deposed members who seek a receivership for the order in Pennsylvania.

In a heated argument with klans counsel, Harrickman, himself a defendant in a suit filed by the klans, said that Evans not only misused the funds of the order but had boasted he was the order and that he could elect presidents, control congress, dominate courts and overthrow state governments.

The Noted Dead

RUTHIN, Wales, April 11.—(AP)—Stanley John Weyman, who for almost forty years has been writing romances principally dealing with French history, is dead at the age of 72.

Graduated from Oxford with honors in modern history, he published the "Story of Francis Chateau" in 1896. From then until 1925 when "Queen's Folly" appeared, he turned out a book a year.

SANTA BARBARA, Cal., April 10.—(AP)—Thirty-six club members of Santa Barbara's exclusive Montecito society set today went about bragging of their newest adventure.

"I rode with Lindy yesterday," was a stock in trade phrase today, uttered proudly and often by the southern belles who were fortunate enough to accompany Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh on one of his nine air trips he made yesterday in his new plane.

America's aerial trail blazer was in a fine fettle and not at all glibly, as he has so often been painted. His cheery smile, absent for the past few days, was much in evidence again. The trips were made from Carpinteria where Lindbergh's new plane is being housed.

Last night Lindbergh bid goodbye to Harry F. Guggenheim, president of the Daniel Guggenheim foundation for the promotion of aeronautics, and his self-styled "month by month employer."

Guggenheim left for San Francisco and is expected to spend several weeks in the bay city and in the Pacific Northwest before returning to New York.

With his farewell to Guggenheim, Lindbergh forecast new future flights when he said to his backer, "I will beat you to New York."

CANADA EXPERTS BUY FAKE WATCHES ON GOTHAM JAUNT

HAMILTON, Ont., Apr. 11.—(AP)—Three members of the city council, sent to New York to inspect engine equipment which the city proposed to purchase, bought "bargain watches" on the visit there which had no works. It was disclosed at a council session.

Controller Morrison revealed the purchase at a meeting called to pass on the recommendation of the three men.

The controller produced one of the "bargain" watches which was of white gold, the hands readily adjustable and so fixed that the winding operation would not arouse suspicion.

"The men who made these purchases," said the controller, "offer us expert advice on the engine equipment and speak to us in technical terms." The announcement was greeted with laughter.

The council failed to make a choice on the \$200,000 worth of equipment the three men had inspected, passing a motion to defer action until 1929.

SALEM, Ore., April 11.—(AP)—The monthly report of George Alexander, state prohibition officer, shows that during the month of March members of the prohibition squad participated in 37 arrests, fines were assessed totaling \$11,745 and jail sentences totaled 2065 days. The agents seized 2775 gallons of mash, 1567 gallons of liquor, 20 stills and one automobile.
