

TRAIN DELAYED TO TREAT RACE HORSE

ROSEBURG, Ore., April 14.—(AP)—Southern Pacific train No. 14 was held in this city at 11:30 o'clock last night for some time while County Veterinarian Nicholas administered treatment to a valuable race horse, "Valley Joe," belonging to A. E. Patterson, famous race horse owner of the coast. The horse suffered a hemorrhage while the train was passing over the Siskiyou and it was feared for a time that the animal would die. Train officials wired ahead to the local veterinarian and he met the train and gave medical aid. The train was not allowed to proceed until the animal responded to the treatment. Wires were sent ahead to Dr. Huthman, Portland veterinarian, who met the train upon its arrival in Portland this morning and continued the treatments. Patterson's string of race horses was traveling in a specially constructed car and attached to train No. 14. Each horse had an attendant. The car was steam heated and the stalls as luxurious as the club car of the train.

GREEK AGITATOR SENT TO PRISON

ATHENS, Greece, April 13.—(AP)—Discovery of a Pangalos plot and decision to send General Theodoros Pangalos to Izeddini prison on the island of Crete was announced today.

Eleven officers were arrested last night in connection with the plot.

A letter stating that Madame Pangalos had contributed 300,000 drachmas (\$3,900) to the conspirators was seized.

General Pangalos has been in prison in Athens on a charge of treason growing out of his rise to power in July, 1928. At that time he assumed the dictatorship and subsequently became president. He was ousted by General Koundylis in August of the same year and imprisoned.

Madame Pangalos was arrested in connection with the Pangalos plot last October and later released.

BELFAST, Northern Ireland, April 14.—(AP) The German steamer Derfflinger which put into Galway for about two hours, reported that she had picked up a message yesterday from a steamer further out at sea that the Junkers plane Bremen had been sighted by that vessel. The name of the steamer was not known and no details were given. The Derfflinger herself did not sight the trans-Atlantic plane.

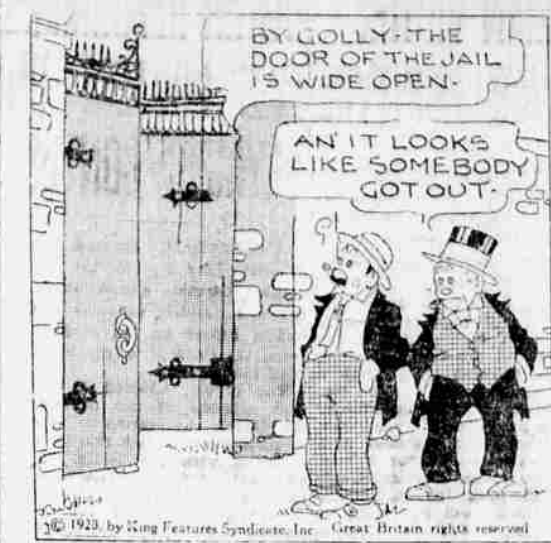
