HEAVY INCREASE IN DODGE SALES

With the added stimulus that has been provided by the introduction of the new low-priced Standard Six, retail deliveries by Dodge Brothers, Inc., for the week ending April 13 in this country and Canada exceeded factory shipments by 67 units, according to word received by Clyde S. Eakin of the Eakin Motor company, local Dodge Brothers dealer, from John R. Lee, general sales manager of the company.

"Retail sales of cars and trucks totaled 6,232 units, which exceeded any week last year and sets a new high mark for 1928," stated Mr. Lee. "Factory shipments were 5,565 for the week. It is significant that Dodge dealer reports show an increase in sales of passenger cars of 52 per cent over the corresponding week in 1927. Last week's retail deliveries were 13 per cent over those of the preceding week and 22 per cent over those of the same week last year."

During the past week retail sales of the Senior Six gained 37 per cent over the preceding week, while the Victory Six models which have been great favorites with the buying public since the day of their introduction again added a 23 per cent increase to their already many sales records."
