LEAGUE SEASON WILL OPEN HERE SUNDAY, MAY 20

Representatives of the ball teams from Dunsmuir, Weed, Klamath Falls and Medford met at Yreka last night. Officers elected are A. S. Nislinger of Ashland, president, Lloyd Noble of Mount Shasta, vice president, M. C. Carpenter, of Weed, secretary and Dan Levy of Dunsmuir, treasurer.

The league will open May 20th with Klamath Falls at Medford and Dunsmuir at Weed. All players except those blacklisted will be eligible to play in the first five games. The balance of the season third and fourth position teams will be allowed new players on a five days notice and the approval of the majority board of directors and president. First and second position teams will be allowed new players on giving two weeks notice with same approval.

Three per cent will be deducted from the total gross receipts to raise a bonus of \$500 to be awarded to the winning team, which will act as an incentive for players to play the best ball possible.

In adopting a name for the league, Manager Court Hall of Medford argued that Oregon-California was natural and sounded better than the longer name should be last and that the California Oregon Power Co. had always regretted that they had not placed Oregon before California when naming their corporation. Hall finally carried his point.

The meeting was enthusiastic and harmonious. A good-natured banding was hurled to and fro between Manager Grover of Klamath Falls and Manager Hall of Medford. It finally ended with Hall betting Grover \$5.00 that Medford would draw a larger gate attendance than any other town in the league. Also another bet of the same amount that Medford would draw one gate of one thousand dollars before the season ended.

Manager Hall says that Dunsmuir and Klamath Falls will have exceptionally strong teams and that the Medford team will have to be strengthened some to cope with the other teams.

Hall says if he can get jobs, he can get the players. But to secure players without jobs would wreck the team financially. Manager Hall is now ready to announce his first string battery.

WORLD'S GREATEST STADIUM WILL BE COMPLETE IN FALL

CHICAGO, Apr. 19.—(AP)—When Nevy meets Notre Dame on Soldier field October 13, in a football classic of the fall, Chicago's \$7,500,000 memorial to its war dead will stand completed—not only as the greatest stadium in the world, but also as one of the world's greatest amphitheaters and exhibition halls.

Famed already as the modern coliseum where 200,000 worshipped at the eucharistic congress, where Army played the Navy and where Tunney defeated Dempsey, for the second time, Soldier field, when completed will include besides a place for spectacular outdoor pageants an extensive series of exhibition halls.

On either side halls 275 feet in length and 50 feet wide will afford great quarters for exhibitions, in addition to the 600 feet long hall at one end.

The temporary wooden structure forming seats at one end of the stadium has been removed and concrete stands are rising in their place. These wooden seats won prominence during the Tunney-Dempsey fight as the \$5 ringside locations. The stadium's builders, the South Park commissioners, have promised to have the work completed on the stadium in readiness for the Navy-Notre Dame test fall.

HAGEN YANK HOPE BEAVERS JUST AS HELPLESS AS EVER

NEW YORK, Apr. 19.—(AP)—Notables of America's golf and tennis circles were bound for Europe aboard the Aquitania today in the annual quest for laurels. Tennis was represented by Miss Helen Wills, national women's champion, and Miss Penelope Anderson of Richmond, Va., and golf by three leading American professionals, Walter Hagen, Gene Sarazen and Bill Mehlhorn. Tom Armour cancelled his passage at the last moment.

The British open championship, won six times in the last seven years by Americans and now held by Robert Tyre Jones, the Atlanta attorney, is the goal of the golfing contingent. Miss Wills will storm the heights of Wimbledon, tennis capital of the British empire.

For Hagen, the glories of the British open are old, but for the others, Sarazen in particular, success at Sandwich would be prized more highly than victory on any other course. It was at Troon, back in 1923, that Sarazen, American, can open champion at the time, met what he has always termed the most bitter defeat of his career. Having made his position in American golf secure by his victory in the open at Skokie (Chicago) in 1922, Gene failed even to qualify in his first British open.

Hagen said he would ask Archie Compston for a postponement of their 72-hole match, now scheduled for April 27-28, as the American's first warm-up for the open. Hagen explained that the original date of the match would give him only one day of practice after his arrival at Southampton and he felt that this would be too little, in view of his comparative inactivity through the winter.

"All of us," Hagen continued, "are sorry Bobby Jones won't come over and try for three in a row. I hold a lingering hope that he will change his plans at the last minute, as he did last year.

"Professional golfers sometimes are jealous of an amateur who takes the play from them in an open championship, but I for one can't be jealous of Bobby. I just have to marvel."

Hagen has played no tournament golf since he won the professional championship at Dallas last fall for the fourth successive year. He also is to meet Aubrey Hoomer in France before he returns to America.

In addition to defending her title in the women's championships at Wimbledon, Miss Wills will enter the French women's championships and will play against British women as a member of the Wightman cup team. Miss Anderson probably will play with Miss Wills in Holland and Berlin.

Edward G. Chandler, who practiced with Miss Wills at Forest Hills yesterday, said that in his opinion the California girl was 50 per cent better than she ever before had been. Each won one set in their practice match.
