More than 150 Medford women, among whom were many well known pioneers of Jackson county took part in the Greater Medford club Founder's Day banquet at St. Mark's Guild hall beginning at one o'clock today. There were the present active members and officers of the organization, and past members who have watched the club in every stage of its evolution, since that day, 25 years ago, when it was organized as the Lewis and Clark club, in an infant Medford, hardly meeting the title of small town.

DOLORES DEL RIO OF SCREEN FAME SEEKING DIVORCE

LOS ANGELES, Apr. 20.—(AP)—Another film couple has taken the divorce trail today by three other pairs of screen folk connected with a romantic marriage trip into Mexico.

The last divorce action connected indirectly with the wedding June 1925 across the border, was announced yesterday when Dolores Del Rio, Mexican star, boarded a train here for Nogales, Sonora, with the intention of filing suit to dissolve her marriage to Jaime Del Rio.

In May, 1925, Edwin Carewe, the director, and Mary Aiken, screen actress, were married in Juarez, Mexico, while the wedding of Bert Lyell and Clair Windsor, both of the films, who accompanied them, followed the next day. The party was chaperoned by Manuel Beach and Agnes Ayres, the film actress.

Since the Beach and Miss Ayres, as well as the Lyells, have been divorced, Carewe's suit for a divorce, recently filed in Mazatlan, Sinaloa, Mexico, still is pending.

Del Rio, who went to New York five months ago, in a "trial separation," will not contest the action and will be represented merely by an attorney.

Each are members of wealthy families of Mexico City. They were married seven years ago, soon after Dolores, then 15, had completed her education in a convent.

FRENCH PLANE TOO SLOW LONG FLIGHT

PARIS, April 20.—(AP) Lieutenant Michael de Troyat who failed to make a non-stop flight to Algiers and return to test the plane in which he hopes to be the first to fly from Paris to New York via weatherbound in Algiers today. He was forced to land by a gale and it was understood that his backers were disappointed in the performance of his plane.

On the flight, he maintained an average speed of only 92 miles an hour, which was considered too slow for trans-Atlantic flying.

Clean Out the Sludge
Even in the case of cars equipped with oil filtering devices, the necessity for occasionally dropping the oil pan and removing the mulsified substance that collects at the bottom has not entirely passed. This item of car-care should be attended to at least once yearly. The screen and pan should be washed out with kerosene and care should be taken to see that they are thoroughly dried before being replaced.
