ANNOUNCE FOREST REGULATIONS FOR COMING SEASON PARTY RAIDS BY HIGH SCHOOL BOYS NO LONGER SMART

Forest regulations to be observed on state timberlands were made public today by D. L. Phillips district fire warden for Jackson county.

During the period from May 15 to October 1, which has been designated as the closed season, it will be unlawful for any person to set on fire or cause to be set on fire, any forest land, grass, grain or stubble, either his own or the property of another, without first securing a written permit from a state fire warden and complying with the terms thereof. It is urged that the forest slashings be burned before May 15 and in accordance with section 21 of the Oregon forest fire laws. And that all loggers, lumbermen, and contractors observe sections 13 to 19, inclusive of the Oregon forest fire laws, in the preparation of this season's work.

The text of section 21 is as follows:

"Every one (by which is meant every person, firm or corporation) engaged in logging or wood cutting, or permitting logging or wood cutting upon his lands in this state, thereby creating a fire hazard, shall, unless relieved by the state forester, each year remove such hazard by burning his annual slashings, by which is meant the tops and inflammable refuse left after logging or wood cutting, at such time and in such manner as shall afford all necessary precaution against the spread of fire to other property."

Section 15 points out further: "Every one conducting a logging operation, whether by steam, horse power or otherwise, shall maintain at the landings of such operation, in good condition for fire fighting purposes only, a tool box containing fire fighting equipment for six men at all times, between May 1 and October 1."

LUMBER BUSINESS FOR WEEK SLOW

NEW YORK, April 20.—(AP)—The lumber manufacturing industry during the week ended April 14, while apparently a little less active than the week before, continued much ahead of a year ago, says the National Lumber Manufacturers' association.

Reports from 796 mills gave total production 9,509,000 feet less than the 796 mills the preceding week. Shipments were 20,000,000 feet less and orders were off 13,500,000 feet.

Decreases in all factors were absorbed by the soft wood branch although output was much larger than at the same time last year. Unfilled orders of 217 southern pine and west coast mills were 733,447,596 feet against 714,421,359 feet the previous week.

SCENIC DRIVE TO OPEN SUNDAY

Medford motorists are reminded that Medford's first scenic drive, the route of which was planned by the Medford Realty Board, will be officially opened next Sunday, and that its circuit, which includes the valley's choicest farming and orchard sections, should be driven in invitation has been especially given to out of state motorists in an effort to have additional settlers make their homes in the Rogue River valley.

The route as announced yesterday, begins at the Chamber of Commerce and is well marked with signs. In connection with the opening of the drive, a special radio program will be presented this evening from 8 to 9 over KMED, the Mail Tribune-Virgin station.
