

STANFORD TRACK YANKEES SHUTOUT, CITY DOG CATCHER 13 ARRESTS MADE

SQUAD SMOTHERS AND HELD HITLESS CALIFORNIA 90-40 BY MACK HURLER

STANFORD STADIUM, CAL., April 21.—(AP)—Stanford's great track and field team, pointing toward a second successive national collegiate championship triumphed over its oldest rival, California—today in a long-sided but thrilling field meet that ended 90-40.

It was one of the worst defeats suffered by California and gave the Cards an edge in the 25 years of competition with seventeen "big meets" won, two tied and sixteen lost.

The Cards rode to victory on the crest of stunning times and performances that saw seven "big meet" records broken and California's Bears shut out in three events.

Coach "Dink" Templeton's blue limbed athletes matched all places in both hurdle events and were shot out in the 120-yard high hurdle. Ross Nichols led his team mates in fourteen 4-5 seconds with the 220-yard low barriers going to West in 24 3/5 seconds. Eric Krenz, Stanford's great sophomore weight man, tossed the shot 48 feet two inches to win that event with ease.

He also captured the discus through to end the day in a sixth his team mate, Johnny Lauritsen for high point honors. Lauritsen gained victory in both the hammer and 220-yard dashes to finish the day with ten points.

Rid Spencer, greatest quarter-mile ever developed at Stanford and captain of the team, and Captain Frank Talbot of California matched speed in the feature event of the meet. In whizzing around the track in 48 seconds flat he clipped nine-tenths of a second off the old record made by Miller of Stanford in 1925. Talbot made a fine closing spurt and finished second, four yards behind Spencer.

The Bears, doomed to defeat by pre-meet statistics, seized an early opportunity to lead their old time foes. In the mile they matched first and second places with Carter leading the field at the tape. The time was 4:23 3/5.

The 100 yard dash brought one of the upsets when Lauritsen of Stanford nosed out the California speedsters. He did the stretch in ten seconds flat to beat out Kiel and Levine.

The "big meet" record holder, both competing today, had their 1927 marks broken. Bill Spauling, Stanford, tossed the javelin 192 feet 11 3/8 inches while his team mate, Tom Joaquin, 1927 winner and record holder until today, was completely shut out of the event.

Kim Dyer broad-jumped to victory over Fred Campbell, also of Stanford, with a leap of 24 feet, 1 1/2 inches, one-half an inch better than the old mark held by Zombro.

Some 5,000 persons saw the Cardinals pick off thirteen first places against two for the Bears. They scored 48 points in the track events and 42 1/2 points in the field. California's efforts netted 29 points from the grinder path and 11 1/2 from the field.
