## To Paint Princess



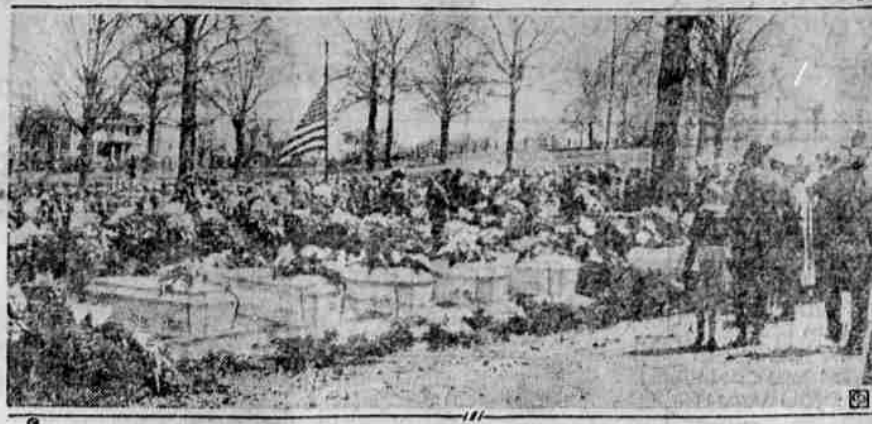

## ONE CEREMONY FOR SCORE OF DANCE HALL VICTIMS



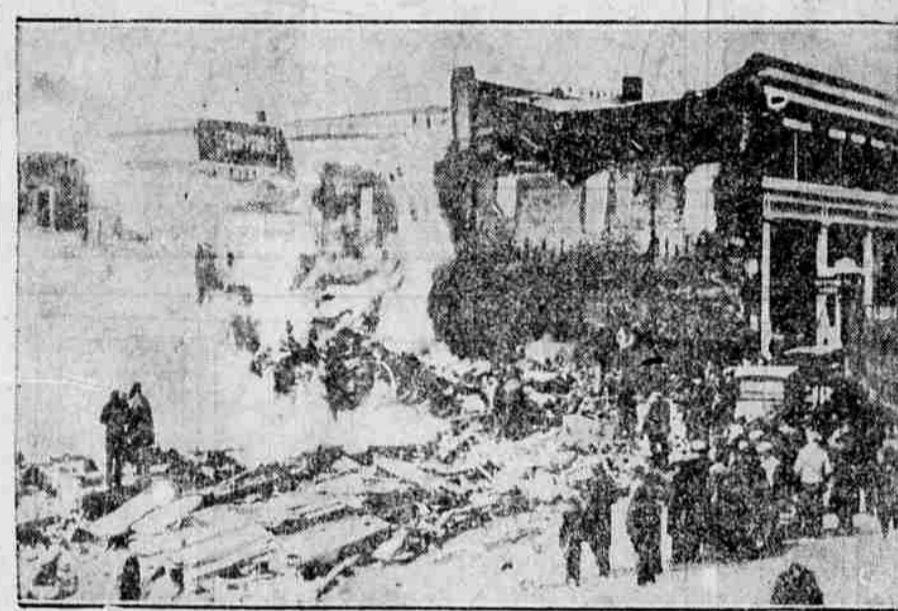
