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MIDDLE IN EGYPT TURNS FOR BETTER, SEND NO WARSHIPS

LONDON, May 2.—(AP)—The Egyptian crisis took a favorable turn today when Sir Austen Chamberlain, foreign minister, announced in the house of commons that the instructions which it had previously been thought necessary to give to certain British warships had now been countermanded.

The British foreign minister also announced that the British note to the Egyptian government's reply, while welcoming its sentiments, also warned the Egyptian government that if the assemblies bill were revived or similar legislation introduced Great Britain would again be obliged to intervene.

It entered upon no discussions of the declaration of 1922.

Sir Austen went on to say that the Egyptian note was a lengthy document which he would issue for publication tomorrow. He read the British government's reply, however.

Pressed as to whether the Egyptian note was couched in friendly terms, Sir Austen said that in the note he had just read "we take note of the fact that the Egyptian government states their decision was taken in conformity with their ardent desire to reach an understanding and with their conciliatory sentiment."

BOMBS HEAVED AT THE BLACK BOTTOM

BUDAPEST, Hungary, May 2.—(AP)—Chemical bombs were thrown when Josephine Baker, American negro dancer, made her first appearance here last night, and forced some of the spectators from the theater. The dancer, however, ignored the commotion and continued with her program which drew hearty applause from the big audience, which included the French minister and other diplomats.

200 INJURED IN POLISH FIGHTING

WARSAW, Poland, May 2.—(AP)—An investigation today of ambulance stations and hospitals revealed that more than 200 persons were injured in yesterday's fighting between the socialists and communists. More than 40 of those injured had bullet wounds. The others sustained bruises and fractures.

IMPORT MOSQUITO TO EAT MOSQUITO

NEW YORK, May 2.—(AP)—French mosquitoes will be pitted against the domestic variety in an experiment to rid the borough of Queens of the pests.

Mrs. Charles E. Williams, head of the mosquito extermination committee of the Good Citizenship League of Flushing, Long Island, said she has written to Professor R. Legendre of the Academy of France for a consignment of the French variety, known as "annihilator" mosquitoes because of their reputation of not attacking human beings but of confining their diet to other mosquitoes.

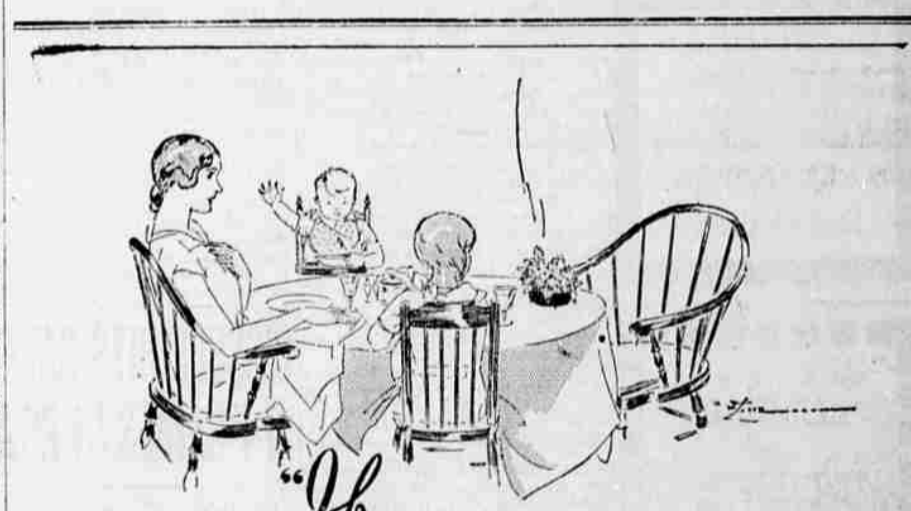
