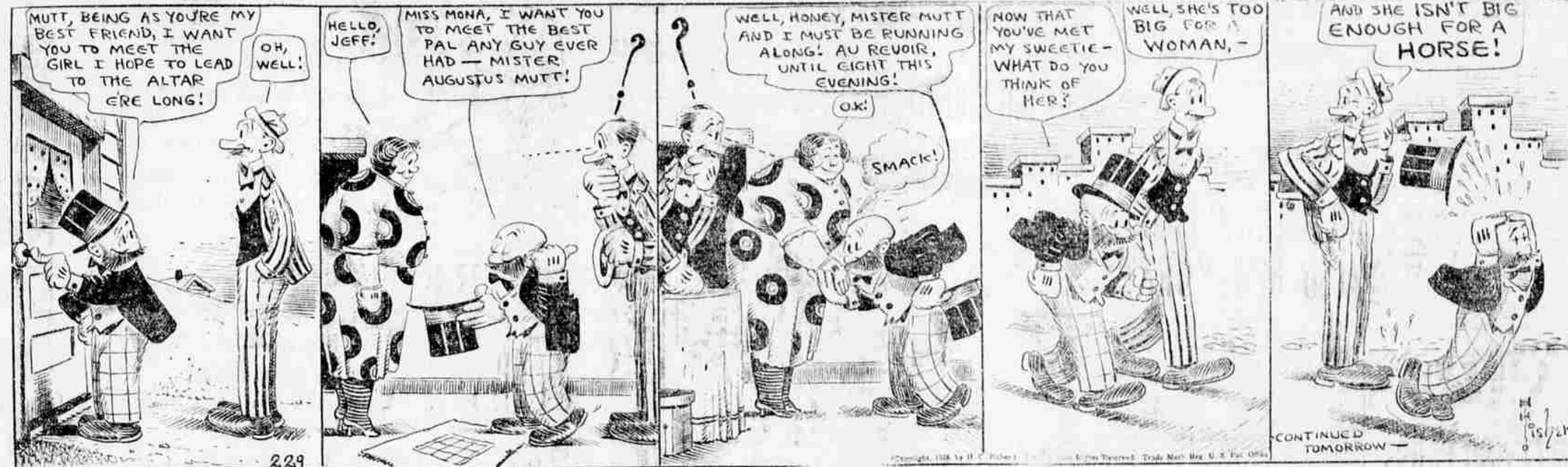

BUTTER QUOTATION STILL UNCHANGED

PORTLAND, Ore., May 2.—No changes were marked up this morning in butter and egg prices, but the butter market was firm and indications were that butter might go a bit higher this afternoon. Demand from outside markets for butter has kept the local market well cleaned up and except for what has been going into storage, practically nothing has accumulated on dealers' floors. Yesterday's receipts of butter were 17,228 pounds with storage holdings increased 2,452 pounds at 38.15 cents. Egg receipts were 1,963 cases with 29,194 cases reported in storage. Country dressed meats were firm at the opening this morning with the exception of veal, which continued weak and drab. Extensive top best light veals were 17 to 18 cents but much less desirable veal sold as low as 13 cents. Real first-class spring lambs were scarce and sold readily at 22 cents. Poultry prices were steady and unchanged with no accumulation to speak of reported by commission men.
