Where we live it is practically impossible to obtain any kind of fresh sea food, except at prohibitive cost, for a large family with a limited income. We would like to "get our iodine" somehow, if you can suggest anything besides the medicine itself.—R. T. J.

Answer—Canned or tinned salmon is available at reasonable cost everywhere. This staple is as rich in food value as most fresh sea fish or shell fish. Possibly other canned sea fish may contain or retain considerable of the natural iodine of the fresh food.

Answer—In certain cases of chronic atrophic rhinitis (so called dry catarrh of the nose) a spraying three times a day with a solution of a level tablespoonful of cane sugar in four ounces of boiled water, will do good. Such solutions should always be at or near body warmth, when used.
