

FACTORY PRODUCTION NEW WHIPPET SIX AT FULL CAPACITY

THIRD PARTY TALK CONTINUES IF AL WINS AT HOUSTON

The tremendous public interest in the new Whippet Six, recently announced by Willys-Overland at the lowest price in the history of light sixes, indicates that this car already has assumed a commanding position in its classification.

To meet the demand for the new light six and also the four-cylinder Whippet and the Willys-Knight sixes, factory production is being maintained at capacity at all the Willys-Overland plants, executives of the company said during the past week. Willys-Overland merchants throughout the country declare that never before in their experience has there been such a demand for a six-cylinder car.

Prior to the incorporation of a seven-bearing crankshaft in the new Whippet Six, a seven-bearing crankshaft was unheard of in a price range as low as these new models. This, it is said, will create a new trend in design among the builders of low-priced light six cars. Other features in the new Whippet Six, which is presented in five body types, include full forced feed lubrication, silent timing chain, extra long connecting rods, invar-strut pistons and a single piece pressed steel, banjo-type rear axle.

Shortly before the introduction of the Whippet Six a sedan model was taken to the Indianapolis Speedway where it established a new record for cars under \$1000 in a 24-hour test. The Whippet Six traveled 137 1/2 miles in the test, averaging 56.52 miles an hour. In a 50-mile speed test it averaged 63 miles an hour. Chick Murray, well known race driver, was at the wheel.

With the heavy advance orders from the Willys-Overland dealer organization and the increasing demand from the buying public, production of this model will be the largest ever reached by the company in the six-cylinder field.

LOS ANGELES, May 5.—(AP)—Fairfax Cosby, attorney and member of the executive committee of the state organization supporting Senator James A. Reed for the democratic presidential nomination, announced today that he had been retained by a number of progressive democrats and republicans to legally launch a third party if Governor Alfred Smith of New York is nominated at the Houston convention in June.

Cosby said: "If Smith is nominated at the Houston convention I shall, at the behest of a number of progressive democrats and republicans as well, who have retained me, prepare the necessary organization papers for filing for a third party, and we will be in the field for a candidate who will support the people."

"Speaking as a private citizen and a democrat, and not as a member of the executive committee of the Honorable James A. Reed, and in view of the outcome of the primaries held last Tuesday in California, it is my firm opinion that solid, honest democrats of the southern states in order to protect their pride as citizens, will enthusiastically support an independent candidate as president, that is, in the event that Smith is nominated at Houston, and I further state, being a southerner, that they will not permit Tammany to be thrust down their throats."

Wilbur Leggett state chairman of the Reed organization, who two days ago telegraphed former Secretary of the Navy Daniels asking him to run as vice-president on an independent ticket, headed either by Reed or Senator Borah, said today that this telegram had brought forth of endorsements from the south. He quoted one from Phillips H. Williams of New Orleans as a sample, as follows:

"Independent ticket, whether headed by good republican or democrat, would receive hearty support of many southern democrats who will otherwise vote republican if Smith is nominated."

Dahlias Grown as Annuals

Dahlias Grown as Annuals. One of the most important bedding plants for producing rich sheets of colors introduced in many seasons is the new dwarf race of single dahlias known as the Cotness hybrids. They grow eighteen inches tall and start into bloom early in August from seed sown in the open ground an May 1 and remain a sheet of bloom until cut by frost.

They form tubers exactly similar to the well known huge double dahlias and may be lifted and stored in much the same manner but they are so easily grown from seed and bloom almost as quickly as from tubers that it is hardly worth while to save the roots except to preserve a certain color.

They give a wonderful array of vivid reds ranging from brilliant scarlet to velvety crimson blacks. There are some fine salmon shaded and some fine yellow. The race has been greatly improved since its introduction a few seasons ago. The first strains were not of uniform height and this spoiled shallow vases.
