

STATE MUSICIANS WILL BE TAKEN ON TOUR OF VALLEY

Among the elaborate plans for the entertainment of delegates and guests gathered in Medford on May 21 and 22 for the state teachers' convention, is to be a specially conducted tour through the valley, when, with the local Realty Board as escorts, the visitors will be shown many of the outstanding points of beauty surrounding Medford. This will take place on Tuesday, the second day of the meeting, and the delegates will arrive in Ashland late in the afternoon, where they will be guests at a tea in their honor at the Ashland Civic club house.

Hostesses at this tea will be the Ashland Music Study club, assisted by the Civic Improvement club, the Monday Study club, the Fortnightly club, the Ashland Study club and the Delphians. Preceding the tea, the guests will be shown around Ashland and the normal school.

They will have dinner that night at the Hotel Medford, the hostesses to be announced later. Mrs. R. C. Mulholland, president of the Greater Medford club, and Miss Jeannette Butler, head of the music and drama department of the organization are in charge of a tea on Monday afternoon for the delegates at the home of Mrs. Delroy Getchell.

On Tuesday a children's chorus, trained by Miss Leona Marsters, superintendent of music at the normal, and composed of the unchanged voices of school children gathered from schools throughout the valley, will be heard in a public concert. The towns to be represented in this program will be Medford, Rogue River, Gold Hill, Central Point, Phoenix, Butte Falls, Eagle Point, Oak Grove, Howard School, Fern Valley, Griffin Creek, and others.

The store is being managed by Richard Wilson, experienced hand in this line of business, having been connected for 10 years with the Metropolitan and Woolworth chains in the East.

more than the 252 claimed for Lowden. Of the Lowden total, his claim to 64 is disputed by rivals, leaving him 188 unchallenged delegates.

In the democratic delegate lineup, Smith's supporters claim 511 1/2 of the 684 votes thus far allotted for the Houston convention. Of the Smith total 73 1/2 are in dispute. To win the democratic nomination, Smith or anyone else will have to muster 733 1/2 votes. The best the New York governor did at the Madison Square Garden in 1924 was 268 but even his most avowed opponents concede that he has bagged more than that number already, with 416 delegates still to be chosen.

Third party talk has cropped up with suggestions for such a movement coming from both democrats and republicans. Thus far, however, nothing definite has been done in this direction and there is little expectation of action until after the national conventions, if then.

Democrats who have brought up the subject for the most part are foes of Governor Smith and are suggesting a bolt in the event of his nomination.

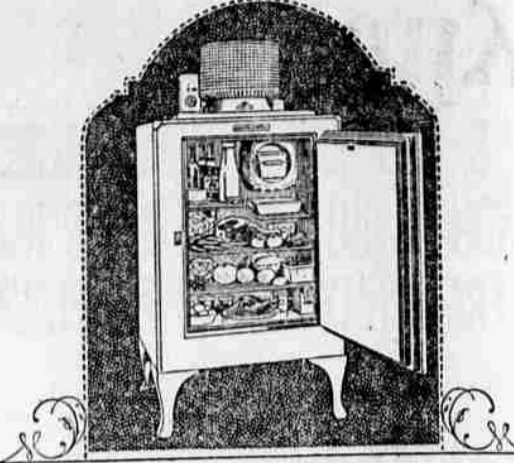
Reed of Missouri was suggested by a California admirer, along with Borah of Idaho, as a logical head of such a ticket. Reed put his foot down hard on the suggestion, as did Josephus Daniels, former secretary of the navy who

receiving official reports from the party's county organizations. In precinct conventions, delegates to the county conventions to be held next Tuesday were chosen. Delegates will go from county conventions to the state convention May 22 at Dallas where Texas' 26 delegates to the republican national convention will be chosen.

FEW ENLISTMENTS NEEDED TO FILL RANKS OF CO. A.

Company A, 186th Infantry, the Medford unit of the Oregon National Guard, will soon be leaving for the annual encampment at Clatsop Beach, and there are a few openings in the organization for re-blooded young Medford or valley men with a desire to serve their country in its preparedness program.

Captain Carl Y. Tengwald, commanding the company, is very desirous of enlisting these few needed men immediately in order that the company can take its rightful place among the other military organizations of the state, which are already filled up to capacity. Medford has always heretofore responded nobly whenever an appeal to the patriotism of the community was involved and it is felt that with this notification in the press that sufficient young men will respond to enable the local unit to also be included in the honor roll of the state. Only a few days remain for enlistments in the company, inasmuch as orders have been received forbidding enlistments after May 15.

The National Guard offers many desirable features to the young man of today, principal among which are the following: "Training to make a young man better physically, mentally and morally; associations that will make lifelong friends; an addition to one's income, as pay is received from the United States government for each drill attended; a wonderful vacation annually; an opportunity to enter West Point; a chance to become an expert rifle and pistol shot and participate in the rifle matches which are held annually in the East; and high school credits towards graduation for attendance at drills.

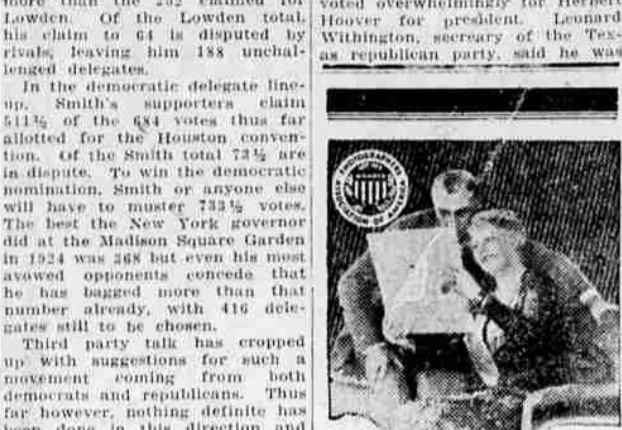
