WASHINGTON, May 9.—(AP)—Repudiation of "all those who indulge in commercial and political corruption," was called for in a resolution adopted without discussion today by the chamber of commerce of the United States. Declaring the organization's "confidence in the general integrity and sound ideals of modern business, brought into high relief by recent disclosures of individual violation of established business practices," the resolution set forth that "the moral turpitude of corruptors of public servants is even greater than that of those whom they debase."

The chamber emphasizes its principle of business conduct, "the resolution read, 'which provides that 'corporate forms do not absolve from or alter the moral obligations of individuals.' It maintains that stockholders of corporations owe it to themselves, to the government and to the profession of business, publicly to repudiate those who misrepresent them. Such stockholders cannot accept the profits flowing from corruption and escape the moral stigma which inheres in such profits. Neither can they permit those transactions, or shield others who do."

"I can't say that I know a person in Iowa, unless that is Wilbur Marsh's state," Smith replied. "I've been meeting him at conventions for years." "Who had charge of your campaign in California?" "I don't know. The only person I heard from there was Mr. Dockweiler (Geldore Dpkweiler, democratic national committee-man). He came to New York a month or so ago and talked to me about California." (Will H. King Contributed.) VanNamee also testified that \$7000 was sent to Fred W. Johnson of Rock Springs, Wyo., for the use of the western state Smith-for-President association. Five thousand dollars went to the democratic publicity bureau, VanNamee added. Other expenditures listed include Will H. King, Portland, Ore., \$800; George E. Christiansen, Stevenson, Wash., \$1500. As to the funds that went to Wardell, VanNamee said that P. H. Abbott of Los Angeles, secretary of the southern California Smith association, H. H. McPhee, democratic state chairman, and Dockweiler had explained the need of funds in that state for conducting the campaign in that state and as they were unable to raise sufficient moneys for such purpose, \$41,350 was forwarded to them. He added that this was used for publicity, distribution of literature, printing, preparing lists of voters in the 8750 precincts in the state, travel expenses and rent of headquarters. "Although a total of \$45,000 was forwarded Mr. Wardell, he returned recently \$3500, which he did not use," VanNamee said, adding that nothing was spent in Oklahoma, Idaho, Illinois, Ohio, Indiana, Iowa, or the New England states, except Massachusetts and Maine. "I did not send any moneys to any of the southern or border states," he said.

Questioned particularly about the expenditures in California, the campaign manager said this was the one state in which a real contest was made against Governor Smith. "Senators Reed and Walsh were conducting vigorous campaigns there," he explained. "The newspapers were giving considerable prominence to it. "It is a big state. There are more than 8000 election districts in it, and I do not think the expenditures were large, taking that into consideration." K. K. Attacks Scored. Replying to Senator Steiwer of Oregon, republican, the chairman, VanNamee said he knew nothing of charges of corruption made against the Smith organization in California by the Los Angeles Express. The witness took a fling at the K. K. K. Anti-Saloon league and anti-Catholic organizations. He said these bodies had been making "scurrilous attacks" on the governor and that the campaign committee had sent out literature "refuting them." "It makes a man indignant," he said. "You do not regret the opportunity to explain it, do you?" asked Steiwer. "No, sir, I am glad to do it," said VanNamee.
