Complete Unofficial Count 40 Large Airplanes Will in Jackson County Shows N. Y. Governor Got 479 Votes to 695 for His Opponents - Canon Had Close Call.

Complete unofficial returns from the 57 precincts of Jackson county brought no material change in the race for county commissioner and sheriff.

Stacy is leading Alden for sheriff by 162 votes, the full county being as follows: Stacy, 1944; Alden, 1382.

The contest for commissioner stands as follows: Love, 2014; Bursell, 1857. Love's majority, 157. Governor Alfred E. Smith carried Jackson county in the Democratic vote as follows: Smith, 479; Walsh, 351; Reed, 261; Workman, 82.
