HAILSTONES KILL TEXAS FARM BOY

LAREDO, Texas, May 22.—(AP)—Four dead, many injured and property damage amounting to many thousands of dollars is the estimated toll of severe wind, hail and electrical storms in widely separated sections of the state. Born on a 70-mile gale, hail stones of large dimensions yesterday beat Valentin Villalobos, 14, to death and seriously injured his mother as they worked in a carrot field near here. G. A. Brewer, foreman of the farm, was injured.

Harvey Hoz, 35, was instantly killed when struck by lightning at his home near Cameron. Mrs. E. E. Gist of Wintersboro was struck by lightning while hanging clothes on a line and was seriously injured.

Sebastian Salinas and Ronald Rodriguez, cowboys, were killed when a house was blown down to miles south of Laredo.

Record Heat in Pendleton. LA GRANDE, Ore., May 22.—(AP)—The temperature fell just one degree short of 90 yesterday, setting a record for the year of '23 above. Late last night a cooling rain began to fall and by 10 o'clock this morning one-tenth of an inch of precipitation had been measured. A month's sunshine has dried the ground considerably and farmers are delighted with the change in weather.

Hickman Captor Honored. PENDLETON, Ore., May 22.—(AP)—Tom Gardane, former chief of police, won the republican nomination in the Friday primary from Sheriff R. T. Conklingham by nearly a two-to-one vote. A count from 58 precincts gave Gardane 2,564 and Conklingham 1,463.

JUDGE PERMITS HUSBAND TO SEND HIS WIFE POSIES

CHICAGO, May 22.—(AP)—The flowers that bloom in the spring, in fact, have plenty to do with the case of Johnson vs. Johnson, in which Judge Sabath today had interested himself.

Judge Sabath last week issued an injunction which in effect prohibited James Harriet Johnson from sending flowers to his wife, Ruth Johnson, protesting that no man should be deprived of the privilege of sending his wife a little gift of roses, has asked that the injunction be set aside.

"I didn't realize that I had issued an injunction of this sort," the court said yesterday in granting a day's continuance in the injunction matter. "I certainly did not intend to prohibit a husband from sending his wife flowers or candy, or from trying to win her back."

"Can I go over to her house to-night and ring the bell and just talk to her?" Johnson inquired.

"No," replied the court, "you can't force love. It must be won through kindness or heroism. I want Mrs. Johnson to come into court and tell me just what she doesn't like about a man who tries so hard to be good to her that he gets into difficulties. I want to talk to both of you and see if this can't be fixed."

Judge Sabath, besides being the author of a play on divorce, has heard 25,000 divorce cases and effected 1259 reconciliations.

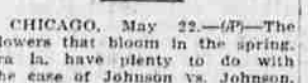
PERFORM AUTOPSY ON SLAIN WOMAN
