

# MUSCLE SHOALS BILL IS PASSED BY CLOSE VOTE

All Night Filibuster By Senator McKellar Fails and Important Measure Is Passed By Both Houses—Veto By President Is Predicted.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—(AP)—Weathering the most stubbornly contested filibuster of the session, the Norris-Morh Muscle Shoals bill was given final congressional approval today when the house agreed to the conference report on the measure.

In abandoning their losing fight against the measure, some of those in the forefront predicted that President Coolidge would veto it but this had no effect on the determination of its sponsors to push it through. Notable among those who bore the brunt of the opposition were Senators McKellar of Tennessee and Tydings of Maryland.

A last minute motion in the house by Representative Byrnes, democrat, Tennessee, to recommit the measure back to the committee proved futile. Speaker Longworth held that the report must be either voted up or down and motion to refer it back was not in order.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—(AP)—Breaking a filibuster which had lasted for more than 24 hours and exhausting those who had carried it on, the senate today adopted the conference report on the Muscle Shoals government operation bill. The collapse of the filibuster came after Senator McKellar of Tennessee, fighting against a project in the bill for a dam at Cove Creek in his home state, had exhausted his physical endurance after hours of speaking.

He frankly told his colleagues that he could go no further when he was turned down on two points of order he had made against the bill, but he added he was certain President Coolidge would veto it.

McKellar, Tydings of Maryland, Daise of South Carolina and King of Utah, bore the brunt of the speech making which ran through the night and morning, but the proponents of the measure as it stands led by Harris, of Nebraska, stood their ground firmly. Never throughout the long hours was there the slightest suggestion of surrender or compromise on their part.

The conference report, which was adopted by a vote of 43 to 34, is a compromise between the senate and house bills and would provide for government operation of the Muscle Shoals project and for the manufacture of nitrogen. The house must yet act.

At the insistence of the senate a provision for manufacture of fertilizer was taken from the report early this week. The compromise provided, however, for the construction of the Cove Creek dam.

Party lines were wiped out in the vote. The senate roll call follows:

## Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, May 24.—(AP)—Despite the disappointment expressed in some quarters over the relatively small decrease in brokers' loans last week, the stock market today continued the recovery begun on Wednesday. Waves of week end profit taking sales swept through the market at intervals, but they proved only temporary interruptions to the upward movement of prices.

A few high priced specialties were whirled upward 5 to 12 points while a long list of industrials and rails were marked up 1 to 3 points.

There was no change in the credit situation but a further advance in the price of export copper helped to stimulate bullish enthusiasm for those shares. The closing was irregular. Winding up the week's operations brought some selling in the last hour which depressed several of the high grade rails and utilities. General Motors also turned heavy. A number of coppers meantime exceeded their advances substantially, a half dozen touched new high prices for the year. Oil Elevators' gain reached 1 1/2 points. Total sales approximated 3,000,000 shares.
