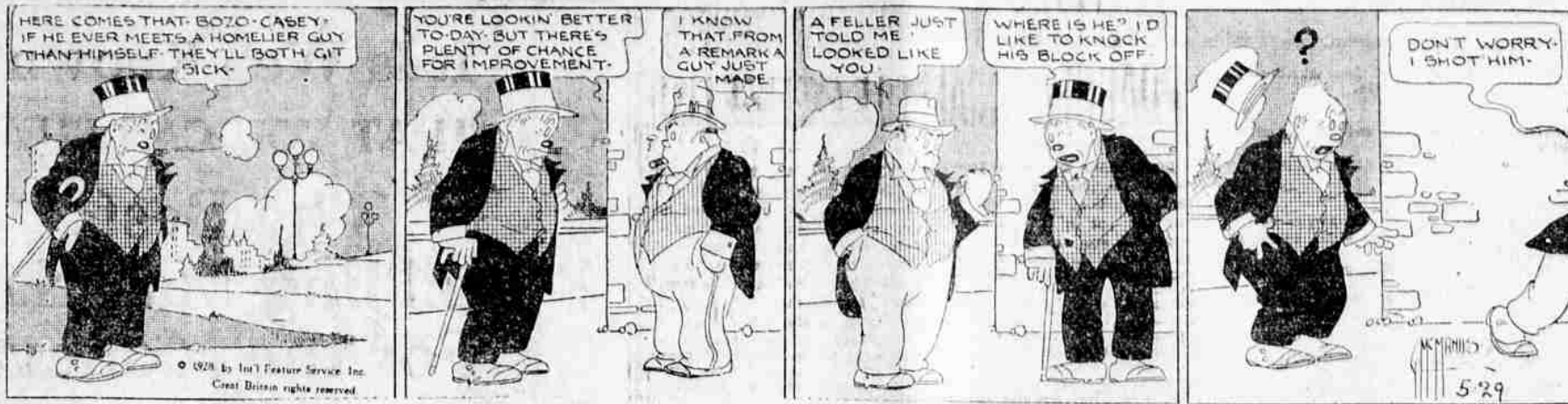

Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, May 29.—(AP) Early declines of one to five points in many instances were cut down or wiped out and more than two score issues were marked up one to nearly fifteen points. Trading was fairly heavy for a pre-holiday session, sales crossing the 2,000,000 share mark before the end of the third hour. The closing was firm. Attempts to cash in some of the paper profits accruing from the spurt in motors and other industrial shares brought a decline running from two to three points in many instances. Several pools, however, stuck to their tasks. Remington moving to a new high at 37 1/2 with a block of 32,000 shares at 35. Radio crossed 206, while International Harvester touched 280. Total sales approximated 3,300,000 shares.
