

### CLUB WOMEN DROP PROBLEMS TO PLAY

SAN ANTONIO, Texas, June 1.—(AP)—Delegates to the biennial convention of the General Federation of Women's Clubs in session here forgot about politics, prohibition, elections and all of the other weighty problems that have occupied their time to spend today in play.

This morning the second division from Fort San Houston, the division that bore the brunt of Chateau Thierry and many other offensives, paraded for the first time in its history before a feminine reviewing officer.

Mrs. John D. Sherman of Estes Park, Colo., president of the federation, acted as reviewing officer. ### CHARGE BUREAU HEAD IS UNFAIR

WASHINGTON, June 1.—(AP)—Affidavits filed with the federal trade commission today charged Commissioner William E. Humphrey with being prejudiced against the Royal Baking Powder company to such an extent "as to be unable to give the benefit of fair and impartial consideration to complaints pending which alleged unfair methods of competition by the company."

The affidavits were filed by Frederick C. Hitch, vice-president of the Royal Baking Powder company; Mrs. Harvey W. Wiley, secretary of the Housekeepers' Alliance of Washington; and Marie B. Dillingham, another member of the alliance.

### Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, June 1.—(AP)—Profit taking interrupted but failed to check completely the resumption of the upward price movement in today's stock market. Extreme gains of one to nearly ten and a half points in the morning trading were cut down, and in a few cases converted into losses by the wave of selling which swept through the market at mid-day, but prices headed upward again in the early afternoon.

The closing was heavy. Widespread speculation for the rise was definitely halted in the last half hour of trading when the call money rate was unexpectedly raised to 6 1/2 per cent, duplicating last week's maximum, the highest for seven years. Radio, which had touched a peak of 223, slumped to 213 and recessions from the day's highest levels ran from one to four points elsewhere. Total sales approximated 3,000,000 shares.

CHICAGO, June 1.—(AP)—William Tilden II of Philadelphia and John Hennessy of Indianapolis, swept the Japanese Tamiro Abe and Yoshira Ohta, in defeat in the two opening singles matches of the American zone Davis cup tennis finale on the Chicago Tennis and Tennis club courts today in straight matches.

Tilden defeated Abe 6-2, 6-3, 6-0. Hennessy defeated Ohta, 6-3, 6-3, 6-3.

### PAIR JAILED AS SILK SMUGGLERS

MEXICO CITY, June 1.—(AP)—Two men were under arrest today in connection with the attempted smuggling of silk into Mexico from the United States, and the attorney of one of them has been ordered to leave the country.

General Jose Alvarez, former chief of President Calles' staff, and magistrate Jorge Castaneda, Benetton were placed in cells at police headquarters, and more arrests were expected.

Telefona Gumpo, one of the most prominent attorneys in Mexico, who has been General Alvarez' counsel for a long time, was ordered to leave Mexico. Gumpo denied that he had any connection with the smuggling operations which led to General Alvarez' dismissal from public post and his arrest. He intends to leave for Havana.

### LINDBERGH FLIES TO 'FRISCO; USES BORROWED PLANE

SAN FRANCISCO, June 1.—(AP)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh landed at Mills field shortly after noon today. He alighted in a borrowed monoplane in which he flew from Long Beach after striking Crissy field at San Francisco and the Oakland airport. He left Long Beach at 5:10 a. m.

LONG BEACH, Cal., June 1.—(AP)—Once more displaying his fondness for disregarding already arranged plans and for avoiding newspaper men, Colonel Chas. A. Lindbergh made an early "flight" away from the municipal airport here at 5:15 in a Ryan monoplane.

He headed, presumably, for San Francisco.

The plane Lindy flew was one loaned to him by the Mahoney Airplane company of San Diego, holders of his famous Spirit of St. Louis, and its sister ship, which he now owns and flies.

The latter plane now is at the Mahoney factory getting a little touching up.

Major Langhorne and Colonel Brockbridge, Lindbergh's flying companions on his recent trip from New York, were with him when he left here.

### BANK TAX SUIT DEFENSE BEGINS

PORTLAND, Ore., June 1.—(AP)—The defense opened today in the trial of the suit by seven Portland banks attacking the law under which bank capital is taxed. Geo. Morrey, of the district attorney's office, said the defense would be based upon two premises—the first that the banks had not appealed to the county board of equalization for relief from the forest asset tax, upon which the suit is based, and second, that by paying the tax for several years, they had admitted its legality.

### CHILD SLAYER OF TOLEDO INDICTED

TOLEDO, Ohio, June 1.—(AP)—The Lucas county grand jury returned a first degree murder indictment here today against Charles J. Hoppe, 24, who confessed he kidnaped seven-year-old Dorothy Slegowski from her bed here and killed her. Her body was found on the porch of her uncle's home Tuesday.

### SPANISH FLYERS FORCED TO LAND

KARACHI, India, June 1.—(AP)—The Spanish airplane Jesus del Gran Poder attempting to break the distance flight record came down yesterday at Nasiriyah near Or of the Cholistan.

Captains Ignacio Jofre and Francisco Iglesias made a forced landing, Nasiriyah, in Mesopotamia, is approximately 2000 miles from Seattle, from which point they started on 11 noon Tuesday.

Seattle, Spain dispatches last night credited the two fliers with having beaten the long distance flight record set by Clarence Chamberlain and Charles A. Levine at 2,311 miles on their flight to Germany.
