

PROPOSED AIR FIELD SUITABLE

National Air Tour Manager and Party Inspect Site—City Praised for Its Aviation Enterprise—Armada To Land Here—Fokker Is Sister Ship of 'Southern Cross'.

PORTLAND, Ore., June 1.—(AP) Ray Cooper, manager of the national reliability air tour, arrived here today in a hop from Medford.

The trim-tored Fokker plane, Pathfinder, of the National Reliability Air Tour, comprising twenty-five planes, scheduled to arrive in this city Saturday, June 16, left this morning for Portland at 8:45 o'clock. The Pathfinder is a sister ship to the Southern Cross, now engaged in a flight to Australia over the Pacific, in the private plane of Secretary Davis and has been flown by Colonel Lindbergh.

The plane landed at the Medford airport yesterday afternoon and spent the night here, members of the party conferring with the air committee of the Chamber of Commerce on local airport conditions. Ray Cooper, manager of the national air tour, stated that, although the Medford airport was entirely too small to suit the purposes of the tour, it would be necessary to land here with the 25 or more ships expected to participate in the tour. "Medford has always been in the lead in aviation matters on the Pacific coast, and shows a spirit of willingness to keep pace with the rapid development of aviation. It is for this reason, and also for the reason that Medford occupies a strategic position with regard to its location, that the national air tour will stop in this city," stated Mr. Cooper.

Both Mr. Cooper and Ray Collins, who will be the official referee of the tour, were enthusiastic over the proposed new airport. In company with the aviation committee of the Chamber of Commerce and Mayor Alexander, the entire party visited the proposed site and commented upon its suitability for airport purposes. The visitors were astounded when told of the low cost of purchasing and improving the field, remarking that the city of Detroit had recently bonded itself for \$2,000,000 for its airport, and that the amount additional would be needed before the field was completed.

Mr. Collins, in a conference with Chamber of Commerce officials, outlined the duties of the local committee in connection with the landing of the tour in Medford. It will be the duty of the Medford committee to make all arrangements for the landing and handling of the ships, as well as care for the passengers during their stay here. Details of the entertainment will be in the hands of the airport committee, composed of Stanley V. Hall, Clyde Eakin, Larry Mann, Floyd Hart, Bert Thieroff, M. N. Hoxax, Frank Dillard and J. C. Thompson. Definite plans will be announced later.

The plane party is as follows: Ray Cooper, tour manager; Ray Collins, tour referee; Carl Keller, member of aircraft events committee; Frank Bogart, Detroit Times; James Pierson, Detroit News; Hugh White, Detroit Free Press; Lieutenant Peter Kane, pilot; Sergeant John Carlson, mechanic; and Lieutenant George Schultzen, who is accompanying the party east, where his mother is ill. Schultzen arrived in San Francisco from the Philippines in time to join the plane.

(Continued from Page One.) practical laboratory work in large forestry tracts owned and controlled by the college. No other school of forestry in the country is situated in the heart of such a large body of commercial timber. Many of the graduates take advanced work in eastern institutions, while others go into the commercial field or enter government service.

Herbert P. Harris, of Central Point, has devoted his college course to a study of chemical engineering, in which department he has earned his bachelor of science degree. The department of chemical engineering is maintained separately rather than as a part of the main school of engineering. In the last four years Harris has taken thorough courses in general, analytical, organic and physical chemistry, modern languages, physics and mathematics. A larger percentage of chemical engineering graduates than in any other group go on for advanced graduate work. Harris is one of 15 graduates of the school this year.

RECOGNITION IS GIVEN JACKSON LIBRARY WORK

U. S. Bureau Designates County System As One of Eight in Land for Mention in Report—Photo of Building Is Used in Illustrations.

A new bulletin has just reached Medford, that published by the United States Bureau of Agricultural Economics on rural libraries. The report represents a careful two-year survey of county libraries all over the United States, describing the importance of rural libraries, different methods and means of rural service and the advantages of the county system.

The Jackson county library system was among the eight chosen for special description. The second page of the report shows a cut of the Jackson county library building and grounds and is one of seven buildings chosen to be shown by illustration.

"The county library means books and magazines for every man, woman, and child in the county, through convenient service stations supplied with fresh, changing collections of books. It means books delivered postage-free to anyone who can not come to the nearest station. It means the use of all the books and magazines you and your children want, for much less annually than the cost of an ordinary book.

"The county library brings first aid to the rural teacher and eliminates her handicap of having few or no books but textbooks for teaching her roundful of lively and restless boys and girls. "With plenty of well chosen books for reference and school reading, geography, history and all other subjects take on fresh color and reality, teaching is enlivened, interest and vigor of effort, and the whole educational process is made more effective.

"The farmer, also, needs and wants facilities for general culture and for a larger, richer, and more varied life. Along with efficient farming and perhaps as a product of it, should go a contented farm people and a satisfying farm life. Cold efficiency is not enough. A mechanical type of life is not satisfying. Human elements are to be considered. The desire for financial reward may spur efficiency, but only happiness and contentment can maintain it. Efficiency is a means, not an end. The objective is a good kind of rural life—good homes, schools, churches, libraries, hospitals, social life and recreational facilities.

"Education is an important factor in efficiency. Through education farmers can make themselves adequate to the solving of the perplexing problems confronting agriculture today. Studies by department and college of agriculture of the relation of education to farm income among 475 farmers in nine states apparently show that the annual earnings of high school graduates are 50 per cent greater than are those of common-school graduates and that the earnings of college graduates are 100 per cent greater than are those of high school graduates.

"Here is the great opportunity of the library for the library is recognized as the second line of educational defense."

government at Peking 17 months ago to maintain peace and protect foreigners. He gave assurance that he was arranging such protection and would continue to do so in the immediate future, regardless of his personal whereabouts. Although the dictator's address and the reply by the Dutch minister, W. J. Godendijk, the dean of the corps, avoided any specific reference to plans for Chang's early departure, the opinion of the diplomat was that the dictator's speech was in the nature of a valedictory.

The dictator's assurances of protective arrangements in the immediate future were received as a hopeful indication that the expected handing over of the capital to the nationalists will be accomplished peacefully. It is known that an interim committee of safety, jointly named the "Chinese Charitable Relief Association," has already been formed. The chairman is General Wang Shih Chen, who served in a similar capacity at Peking's last turnover in 1926. The committee is arranging for the orderly transfer of authority to the incoming forces.

Despite the evidence of Mukden's withdrawal to Manchuria and the heavy exodus of Chinese affiliated with the Mukdenites in Peking, the foreigners, with the exception of the Japanese, are not alarmed. "The opinion is held in authoritative quarters that a very early measure, in which the American legation is participating, including the concentration of nationals in the legation quarters, will be unnecessary.

There are no signs of the breaking down of Mukdenite discipline. The troops are orderly and well-behaved.
