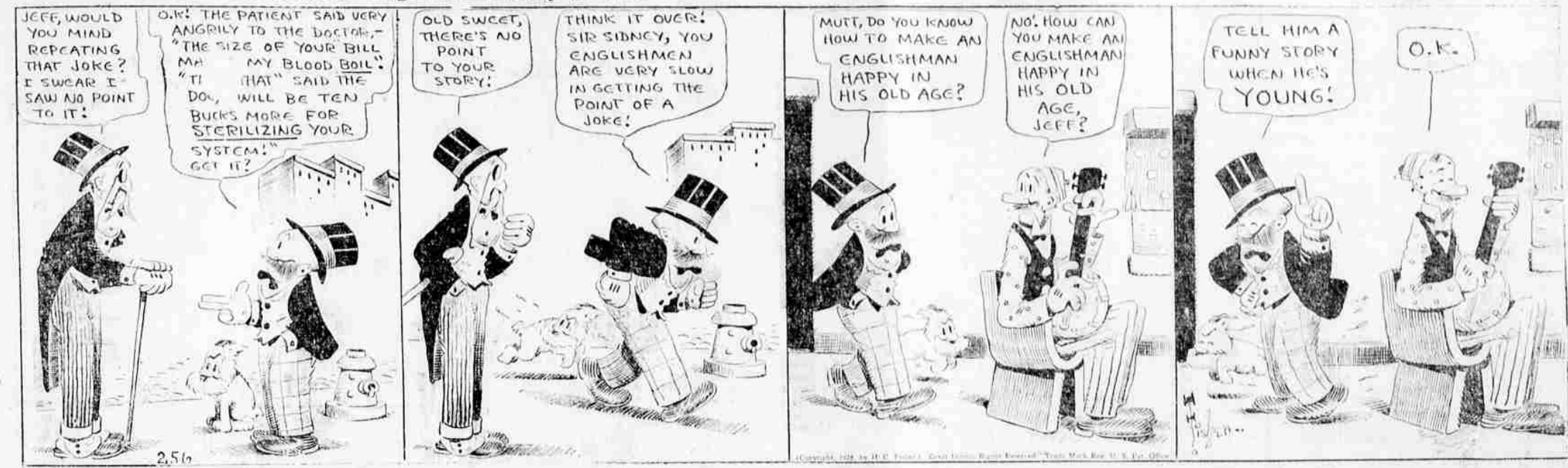




MUTT AND JEFF—Just Give An Englishman Plenty of Time

PORTLAND EGG PRICES FIRMER; BERRIES HIGHER

PORTLAND, Ore., June 2.—(AP) Reports from principal markets through the country that storage holdings of eggs are considerably lower than at this time last year, coupled with the belief that the week of the laying season has passed, tend to make the local market very firm here today and all grades were quoted higher except standard extras. Standard firsts were half cent higher at 25 1/2 cents, medium extras were a full cent higher at 22 cents and medium firsts climbed one and a half cents to 22 cents per dozen. Reports of eggs were unusually heavy yesterday at 5,848 cases. Storage holdings last night were reported at 80,255 cases. Although the butter market showed a firm tone today, prices were steady at yesterday's figures. Yesterday's receipts were 24,902 pounds and storage holdings 545,257 pounds. Poultry prices were generally weak this morning and large accumulations of live birds were reported. Broiler classes alone were fairly well cleaned up and the market tone firm. Country dressed meats were druggery. Prices were unchanged from yesterday's quotations. Strawberry prices were sharply higher on wholesale produce markets this morning and indications were that available supplies would be cleaned up by noon. Demand by canners added to the usual week end inquiry lifted values about 25 cents per crate. Most sales ranged from 20 cents to \$1.50 while a few especially fine crates sold higher. Cherries are coming in in larger quantities daily and next week will see good supply. Royal Annes were quoted today at 12 1/2 to 15 cents per pound, while Bing's, of which the supply was limited, sold at 17 1/2 to 20 cents.
