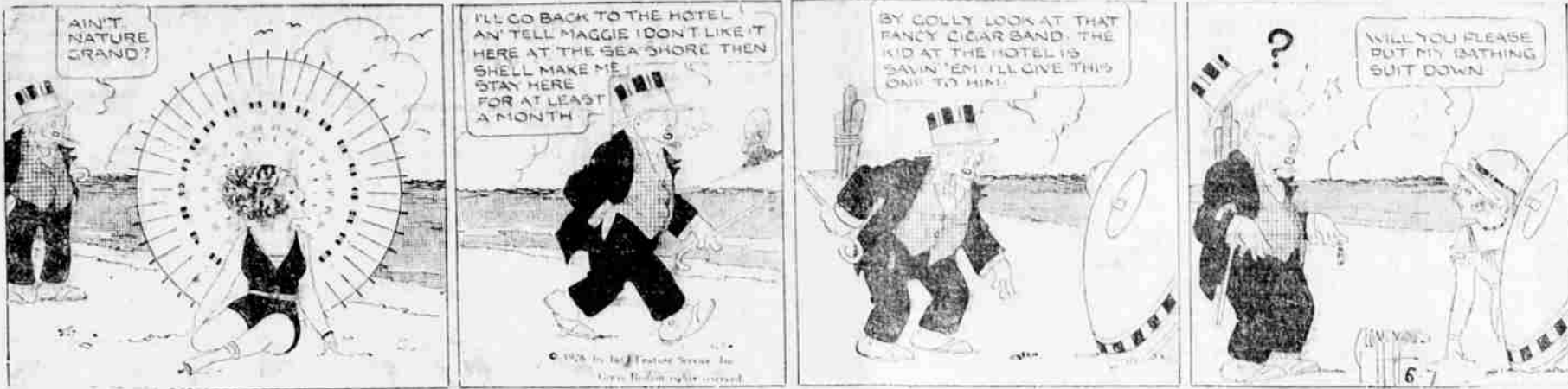


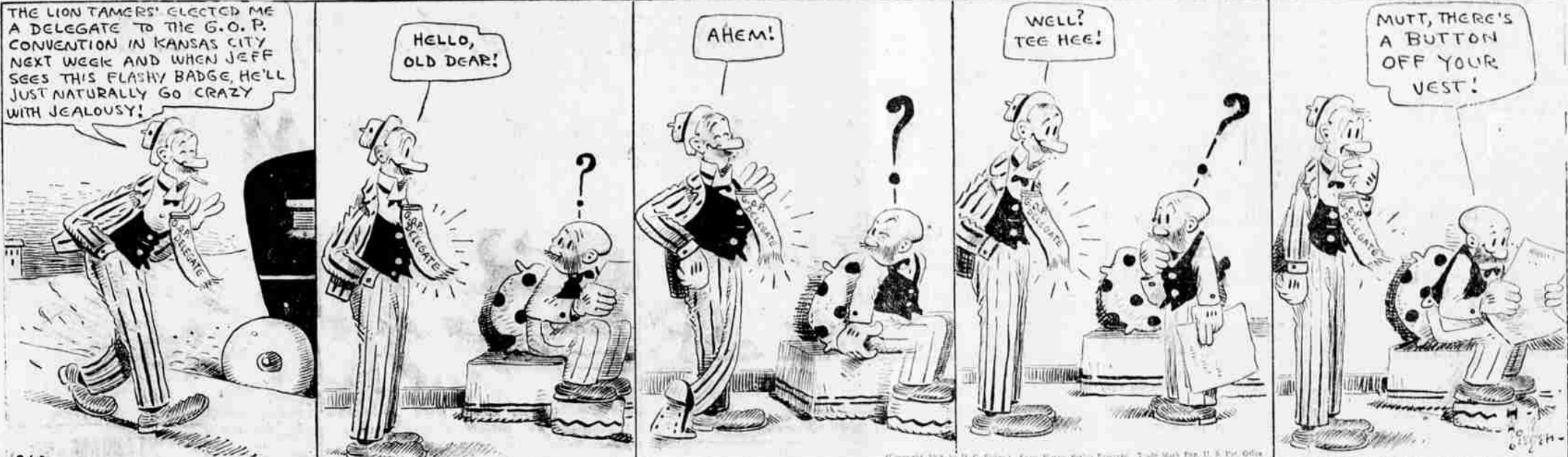

Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, June 7.—(AP) Reactionary tendencies predominated in today's stock market despite repeated efforts of pools to revive bullish enthusiasm. Extreme nervousness over the political and credit situations led to a heavy liquidation of stocks by frightened investors and speculative and aggressive selling on the part of the professional element. Bulls were heavy throughout while the rallies in the industrial group failed to hold. Violent recession took place in some of the high priced specialties for which there is a thin market. Adams Express, United States Cast Iron Pipe, Case Threshing Machine and American Express were hammered eight to nearly eleven points below yesterday's final quotations while Lamont, Manhattan Electrical Supply, General Asphalt common and preferred, National Tea, American Lined and International Telephone sold down three to nearly five points. The closing was heavy. Pack and Motors was rushed up around 8 1/2, the year's high, on rumors of a new motor combination, but the general list did not show much recuperative power. Although a few volatile specialties snapped back in impressive manner, including Idaho and Wright Aero. Total sales approximately 3,909,000 shares.
