

### NEW ENGINEER AT CRATER LAKE FORMER RESIDENT

The new resident engineer of Crater National Park, who has been assigned to duty in engineering charge of the big improvement program that will be completed this summer, is W. J. Webber, a former resident of Medford from 1907 to 1910, and a graduate of the Medford high school.

Mr. Webber has arrived here from the field headquarters of the national parks system at San Francisco, and was spending today in conference with Superintendent C. G. Thomson of Crater National Park, and will probably leave tomorrow or Sunday to actively take up his duties there.

While the park labor crew has opened the road from Anna Springs camp to as far as park headquarters, or government camp, and other valley people who contemplate drives to Crater National Park within the next few days, are advised that the state highway crew engaged in closing the Crater Lake highway has only completed that work to some distance this side of the Medford park entrance.

It still is not known as to just when the park will open formally for the entertainment of tourists beyond the fact that it will not be later than June 25th, on which date the California Press association assembles there for its three days' convention.

Despite this, all arrangements are being completed by the park department for the opening of the Crater Lake season, and the headquarters offices may be moved from the federal building in this city the last of next week to their summer quarters at headquarters, or government camp, in the park.

R. W. Price, general manager and vice-president of the Crater National Park company, is expected to arrive in the city in the next few days, when he will announce the date of the throwing open of the lodge to general visitors. The lodge and other concession employees were all engaged for the season some time ago, and are only awaiting notice to assemble in Medford and go to the park.

Superintendent Thomson also has had his force of rangers and park laborers selected for some time past. The ranger force comprises the following: C. L. Crook, north, Elgin, Ore.; R. B. Beck, west, Medford; Lester Turnbaugh, south Klamath Falls; D. C. Fisher, rim, Klamath Falls; N. B. Ashcraft, east, Long Creek, Ore.; V. Coverstone and H. Hildreth, headquarters, Bute Falls; Stanley Woodruff, Anna Springs, Klamath Falls.

### RESCUE WORK IS EMPHASIZED AT AQUATIC CLASS

Advanced swimmers are urged to attend the free classes being conducted at the Merrick Natatorium this week and next under the auspices of the Jackson county Red Cross with George Hughling, of the University of California, in charge. New methods of breaking holds, and resuscitation of drowning persons are being featured by Hughling.

Beginner's classes are larger each day, with 50 older women going in at 7 o'clock last night.

According to some of the spectators there was a great variety in form, the fat and the lean, determined to do or die in trying. The last two days of the series of lessons will be devoted to tests. Beginners who are able to swim 50 feet, using two different strokes will be given buttons and emblems and to be awarded for life-saving feats.

Classes begin at 8 each morning with lessons from seven years to 15 leading to swim. Following that hour, girls of the same ages have the tank. At 10 and 11, advanced pupils are instructed. Mr. Hughling rests in the afternoon and begins work again after dinner. Senior life savers meet at 8 in the evening.

This is the fourth annual swimming drive put on by the Red Cross here, and according to those in charge, interest this year is greater than ever before.

He said he would qualify, and get his name on the November ballot. It required considerable urging on the part of democratic warhorses of Jackson county, to induce Wilbur to enter the lists.
