She came here to paint the local Junior high school but her daily lunch basket and hurried off to his studies. It is characteristic of the pretty Mrs. McGarvey not to relinquish the place she has earned for herself at the top of the ladder in her chosen profession, even for the satisfaction of eating her lunch in the shade. She came here for both sentimental and business reasons, she would rather eat her share of it there.

It was in Manchester, Iowa, her former home where she met her inspiration to take up the work she now does. Her husband, Mr. McGarvey, a painter, kalsomine and expert wood finisher had been struggling with orders for painting. These he could not fill personally on account of having only one arm. So he let these jobs out to his assistants on a percentage.

Time came when the living earned by Mr. McGarvey was not all it should be for a family of four. Mrs. McGarvey has two sons, Leonard, 19 and Paul 16 and the one-armed painter had been disinterested in the fact of his being able to handle the big painting jobs, which came his way only to be turned over by him to both arms.

Having watched her husband at work and assisted him upon several rush jobs, Mrs. McGarvey was sitting alone at home one afternoon, mending socks when her phone rang and a man hurriedly inquired whether or not Mr. McGarvey, the contractor could handle a rush paper hanging job.

The well-arched eyebrows of the young wife were drawn closely together for one brief second in a concentrated thought before she answered sweetly: "Yes, sir, we shall be able to fill the order in three days. What is the price, please?" The man told her his name and address.

That night Mr. McGarvey was met at the door of his little bungalow home by a pair of beautiful blue eyes above a bundle of crisp ginham, and informed that from now on, Mrs. McGarvey was going to furnish the other arm on the McGarvey payroll and fill the orders for paper hanging.
