

NATIONAL GUARD STARTS TO MOVE TO ENCAMPMENT

SALLEM, Ore., June 12.—(AP)—The 3000 citizen soldiers comprising the Oregon National Guard will begin moving by eight special trains today and tomorrow for the annual two weeks of training at Camp Clatsop. Brigadier General George A. White, commander, says he expects a 100 per cent attendance. The 182nd brigade and its attached units, including company A, 114th engineers, battery A, field artillery, hospital company No. 167 and the state staff corps, will train on Clatsop plains, and the 248th coast artillery will, as usual, train at Fort Stevens.

In the erection of new mess halls, administration building and larger warehouse, the federal government has, in preparation for this year's training, spent about \$50,000.

Troops pay for the period will be over \$70,000. Oregon cities sending troops to the camp are Klamath Falls, Ashland, Medford, Grants Pass, Roseburg, Cottage Grove, Springfield, Eugene, Corvallis, Marshfield, Albany, Lebanon, Silverton, Dallas, McMinnville, Forest Grove, Hillsboro, Salem, Woodburn, Oregon City, Gresham, Portland, The Dalles, Pendleton, La Grande, Union, Baker, St. Helens, Astoria and Tillamook.

NERVES UNSTRUNG KILLS WIFE AND SHOTS HIMSELF

ASTORIA, Ore., June 12.—(AP)—Evan Hathaway, fisherman and fish buyer, aged about 60, was recovering in a hospital here today from two superficial bullet wounds in the chest, inflicted by himself after he had shot to death his wife, aged about 30, following a quarrel at their home on the John Day river, about five miles from Astoria.

Coroner E. H. Hughes plans to hold an inquest tomorrow. He said Hathaway declared his wife had been nagging him and his nerves were unstrung. Hughes said Hathaway had lived for many years on the John Day river and that his wife was an Indian girl from Dahlia, Wash. They have four children, ranging in age from two to nine years.

Convention Side Lights

KANSAS CITY, June 12.—(AP)—A local show took the attention of many of the delegates for a brief space last night. Kansas City staged an old fashioned political parade, with floats and bands and flaming torches. A long line marched through the downtown streets and offered a brief diversion from the political shouting and whispering in hotel lobbies.

Several thousand out-of-towners slipped out for a glance at the marchers, but within a half hour the political grind was on again and, except for a few photographs that will live for a day or two, the parade passed into history.
