

GIANNINI'S CABLE TENDS TO BOOST ITALY B. STOCKS

CHICAGO, June 14.—(AP)—A. P. Giannini, founder of the Bank of Italy, cabled from Rome late yesterday to James A. Baughman, president, warning legitimate investors in Giannini stocks to "sit tight."

What is happening is in accordance with predictions and request of January that stockholders "liquidate enough so as to get out of debt," cabled the executive.

"Prospects are bright as ever and it is gratifying to see how splendidly our legitimate stockholders have stood with us. They will not regret it."

The cable had a somewhat steadying effect on Giannini stocks. Speculators who had been able to weather the first storm were forced to unload yesterday with the coming of additional loans by bankers overnight but the stockholders who had paid in full for their stocks—in all banks and other issues—clung to them in most instances.

The leaders all closed yesterday higher than at the opening although in some instances, the closing prices were below those of the day before.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 14.—(AP) Responding to the lead of the New York market and the placing of large supporting orders, stock prices on the San Francisco stock and curb exchanges made a brisk recovery today from the uncertain quotations of yesterday. The general trend of the list was decidedly upward although here and there a few soft spots were evident.

Bank of Italy opened at 210, where it closed yesterday and then climbed to 220, later dropping 3 points. Banqueting corporation advanced to 14 1/2, later receding to 14 1/4. American company, opening at 165 1/2, climbed to 175 before dropping back to 165.

SITUATION IN CHINA CONFUSED

SHANGHAI, China, June 14.—(AP)—The Chinese political situation, complicated by the capture of Peking by the nationalists and their allies, has become even more involved by recent developments.

Chian Kai-Shek, nationalist generalissimo, who recently resigned his military post, yesterday boarded a Chinese gunboat at Nanking and proceeded secretly to Ningpo where he will go to his birthplace Fenchow, ostensibly to recuperate. Previously his resignation had been rejected by the nationalist authorities. Before leaving Nanking, Chian ordered removal of military headquarters from Nanking to Nanjing, whither the armies under his command are withdrawing.

While the capture of Peking was nominally a nationalist triumph, the actual troops in the field in the capital consisted of the nationalist allies, Feng Yu-shan, leader of the peasant army, and Yen Hsin-Shan, military governor of the province of Shanxi.

Both Feng and Yen are more or less independent and recent dispatches have indicated that Feng was beginning to act quite independent of the wishes of Yen, who appears close to the nationalist group.

OREGON FLAG DAY DATE IS NAMED

SALEM, Ore., June 14.—(AP)—A proclamation was issued from the office of Governor Patterson today setting aside Thursday, June 14, National Flag Day, as a day of special observance in Oregon.

It was requested that "on that day the flag be displayed from public buildings, places of business and homes; that children be instructed in the meaning, due national emblem; that fraternal, civic and patriotic organizations fittingly commemorate to the adoption of our flag; and that all citizens rededicate themselves to the principles and institutions which are symbolized by the flag of the United States."

HIGHWAY CONDITIONS



The following is the present status of the road oiling program:

Newport to Hebo.—Macadamized highway in excellent condition.

Columbia River Highway.—Oiling operations are under way between Irigon and Umatilla. Spreading top course of heavy oil which is immediately covered with screenings. One-way traffic under direction of flagmen is being maintained for distance not to exceed one mile where oil is being spread. Public delay to traveling public account one-way traffic, but cars are not required to travel on fresh oil.

Old Oregon Trail.—Oiling operations will be under way during the coming week between Union and North Powder. No detours. One-way traffic.

The Dalles-California Highway.—Oiling operations will be under way during the coming week between Chemult and Fort Klamath Junction. No detours. One-way traffic.

McKizie-Bend Highway.—Oiling operations will be under way during the coming week between Bend and Sisters. Through traffic detoured by way of Tumalo market road and Lower Bridge market road.

Mt. Hood Highway.—Oiling operations are under way between Hood River and Forest boundary. Detours are available as far as Parkdale with one-way traffic beyond that point. Bituminous macadam construction will be under way during the coming week between Zig Zag and Sandy. One-way traffic will be provided for.

Oiling operations are under way between Swim and Wapinitia road and the road is closed east of Wapinitia road.

Corvallis-Newport Highway.—There is fresh oil on this road from the foot of Kline's mountain to Eddyville. Motorists should be warned to drive carefully at moderate speed. Oiling operations will be under way during the coming week between Toledo and Newport. No detours. One-way traffic.

McMinnville-Tillamook Highway.—Bituminous macadam construction is under way between Grand Ronde and Hebo. One-way traffic.

Medford-Crater Lake Highway.—Oiling operation under way between Prospect and park boundary. Oiling one-half of roadway at time and providing one-way traffic under direction of flagmen where there is fresh oil.

Roosevelt Highway (U. S. No. 101).—Astoria to Seaside, paved. Seaside to Mohler, macadam. Mohler-Miami, highway route via Wheeler, Brighton, Lake Lytle, Rockaway and Bayview. Bayview to Garibaldi under construction but open to travel from each end. Through travel between Mohler and Garibaldi advised to take inside or Foley Creek route which is graveled throughout. Miami-Tillamook-Hebo-Neskowin-Devils Lake-Siletz River, part paved, part oil-macadam, balance macadam. Siletz River-Otter Rock-Newport, macadam.

The highway is not constructed between Newport, Waldport and Yachats but it is possible to get through via a beach road at low tide. No road between Yachats and Florence. Just a trail between Florence and Reedport. Reedport to Lakeside, under construction. Lakeside to North Bend-Marshfield-Coguille-Bandon-Gold Beach-State Line, paved from North Bend to Couquille; balance excellent macadam road. Free ferry to North Bend. Rogue river ferry at Gold Beach, free from 5:30 a. m. to 10 p. m. after which time the old ferry is used and on which there is a charge of 75 cents a car.

Crater Lake Road.—Crater Lake road will be open to rim June 18th. Junction City-Florence. — Good gravel road to Mapleton. Last five miles into Mapleton somewhat rough. Mapleton to Cushman and Florence, passable only in dry weather and very rough. necessitates slow, careful driving on account of deep ruts.

Mt. Hood Loop Highway.—The Mt. Hood Loop will be open to travel by June 15th, at which time the road will have been completely oiled and graded and in good condition the entire distance. There will not be any trouble with either oil or snow. At the present time and until June 15th, the road is open only as far as the Wapinitia cut-off from the south side, and to the Cooper Spur road from the north side.

Wapinitia Cut-Off.—Government Camp to Maupin, 45.6 miles. This cut-off is now in very fair condition. There still remain 15.8 miles of forest road of which 12.8 miles is two-way road and three miles one-way road. This portion of the road is inadvisable after rains. The rest of the road is good gravel. There is a saving of 34.4 miles between Portland and Bend via this route against the Dalles-California highway.

Hood River-White Salmon Bridge.—The Columbia river has receded and the Hood River-White Salmon bridge across the Columbia is no longer to travel. No detours or ferry to either way.

Corvallis-Newport Highway.—Some oiling being done 20 miles out of Corvallis for two or three miles.

Asa Highway.—Macadam road in excellent condition.

Newport-Waldport.—Beach road passable but rough; some plank.

Waldport to Yachats.—Beach road in good condition.

Kings Valley Road.—Dallas to Wren (Newport-Corvallis Highway). Gravel road in good condition.
