

FLYING CLOUD AND MAD BULL NOW LEADING

Grants Pass Entries Take Lead in Redwood Marathon; Hopi Indian Favorite Drops Out; Zuni Contender Can't Be Found.

GEYSERVILLE, Cal., June 15.—(AP) Two Karok Indians this morning had a comfortable lead over the remainder of the field of 29 runners in the second day's running of the Redwood Highway Indian marathon. Flying Cloud, second place winner in last year's race at 7:30 a. m. was resting at Cloverdale, 24 miles from Santa Rosa, his starting place at 5:59 a. m. this morning. Three miles behind him was Mad Bull, another Karok who took first place honors last year, with a seven mile advantage over Chief Geysler, in second place.

There were rumors of dissension between Bill Hayward, track coach of the University of Oregon and at present trainer of the Karok, and Mad Bull's father, the latter claiming that Hayward was endeavoring to hold the runner back by making him believe his feet were in bad condition.

Mad Bull was forced to pull up for medical treatment nine miles south of Cloverdale after a rest. He was severely chafed but his trainer said he would continue. The Karok had covered seventy-seven miles since leaving Sausalito.

One of the Hopis, Arthur Pohiquantewa, re-named Thunder Bird, dropped out of the race this morning with a badly sprained right ankle. His trainer said he could not continue. The little Hopi was one of the favorites.

The rest of the field, with the exception of Chochee, Zuni Indian trained by Mike Kirk, was strung out between here and Santa Rosa. Chochee was nowhere to be found, having dropped out of sight since leaving Santa Rosa early today and Kirk was conducting a frantic search for him. The general belief is that he stopped running to rest for a short period.

SANTA ROSA, Cal., June 15.—(AP) Flying Cloud, Karok Indian entered by the Oregon Cavemen in the 48 1/2 mile Indian marathon from San Francisco to Grants Pass Ore., had a slight lead over his 28 rivals in the race early today, the second day of the contest.

Flying Cloud was some distance north of here, with the two Arizona Hopis, Arthur Pohiquantewa and Dan Comahungtoma, closest on his trail. The Hopis camped two miles beyond here. Fourteen of the Indians had checked in here early today and the others were strung along the highway at various points between here and Sausalito.

The Zuni Indians expected by fans to divide the \$10,000 prize with the Hopis, got a poor start yesterday and observers practically conceded that the Hopis would reach Ukiah first. The Hopis expected to reach that point, about 113 miles from San Francisco, by noon today. Marathon fans believed the Arizona would cut down Flying Cloud's lead and pass him this morning.

Seeley Hall Gets Bardwell's Wheels Eight Years Late

In the fall of 1920, when Seeley V. Hall was agent for the Chandler Motor company in this city, Ralph Bardwell bought one of the autos from Hall and ordered a set of wire wheels. THREATEN TO TAKE UP WITH DEMOCRATS

KANSAS CITY, June 15.—(AP)—Defeated in their attempt to write the equalization fee principle into the republican party platform, farm leaders of the middle west plan to carry their fight to the democratic convention at Houston. Frank W. Murphy of Wheaton, Minn., a delegate to the convention here who made a speech on the floor in behalf of the minority farm plank, attacked the convention farm action here in a statement today and said his group would go on to the Texas conclave in an effort to obtain the relief "denied them" by the republicans. "I am speaking for the farmers," he said, "when I say they must accept the vote on the farm relief plank as notice to them that the republican party is not big enough to take them into protective system and that their vote is not regarded as necessary to party success."

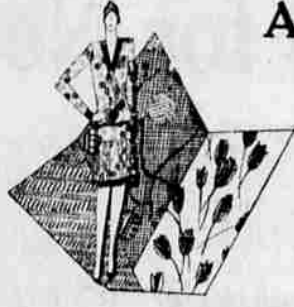
