NEW YORK, June 16.—(AP)—
Renewal of selling pressure in to-
day's stock market disclosed the
presence of a number of weak
spots, particularly among the high
priced specialties. Early declines
of one to nearly seven points were
cut down and in a number of cases
wiped out by the late rally which
was stimulated by the covering
operations of bear traders.
Radio, Weight and DuPont each
broke six points to new lows on
the current reaction, although Radio
had regained all its loss in the last
hour.
International Harvester dropped
6 1/2 points. Case Threshing 4 1/2,
American Bank Note 4, and Olin
Electro, Curtiss Aero, American
International and International
Telephone sold down three to
nearly five points. General Motors
dropped to 17 1/2, recovered and
climbed more than a point higher.
The close was irregular. Total
sales approximated 1,300,000
shares.
