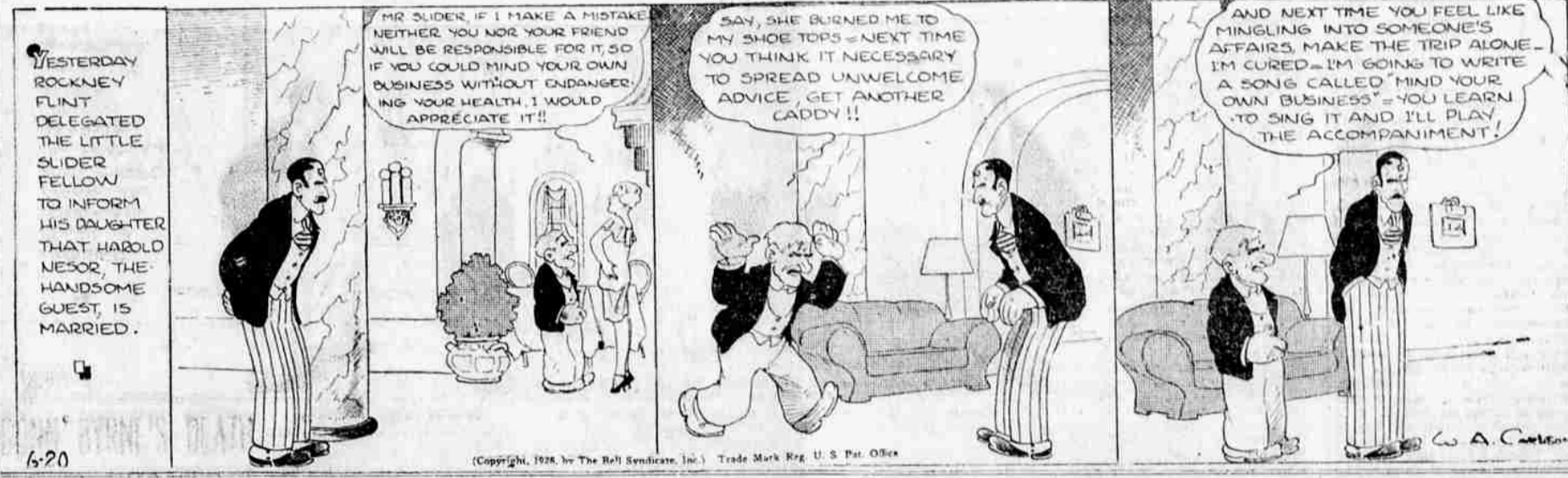

An earlier rally had been checked by stiffening money rates. The recovery was led by Radio, which moved up to 17 1/2, from the day's low of 16 1/2. United States Cast Iron Pipe up to 250, and International Harvester 12 to 263. Total sales approximated 2,200,000 shares.
