

TAGGART DENIES HE WAS SPEAKING FOR AL SMITH

HOUSTON, Texas, June 21.—(AP)—Denying he was speaking for Governor Alfred E. Smith in a statement issued last night, Norman E. Mack, national committeeman from New York, pointed out that he was expressing his own views when he said Governor Smith stands for state's rights and personal liberty for the individual.

"I was not talking for Governor Smith," said Mr. Mack, but for myself. In my statement I was expressing my own convictions. I have stood all along."

He said he had no connection with Governor Smith and his views were not those of Smith, but his own.

George R. VanNamee, pre-convention manager for Governor Smith, also issued a statement saying no one here is authorized to speak for the New York executive on prohibition, the League of Nations or any other subject.

"Governor Smith will take care of that himself," he said.

CALIF. LAWYER IS ACCUSED OF FRAUD IN SALEM

SALEM, Ore., June 21.—(AP)—Obtaining money by false pretenses is charged against J. A. Anderson, claiming to be a California lawyer, in a warrant for arrest issued here yesterday.

Anderson, accompanied by E. J. Frazier of Eugene, is accused of persuading stockholders of the insolvent Comopolitan Chain Stores to give them a per cent of their subscriptions as fees to start litigation against the company.

The whereabouts of Anderson is not known. Frazier has been about Salem for several days and on Tuesday told State Corporation Commissioner McCallister that he would pay back the money obtained. He turned over \$500 to McCallister as part of the amount. It is believed the two men collected about \$1500.

The charges against Anderson are based on affidavits obtained by McCallister from some of the stockholders.

MUTINY BREAKS OUT AT SEA, AID RUSHED BY BOAT

COLOMBO, Ceylon, June 21.—(AP)—The Australian Commonwealth liner Jervis Bay reported by wireless to Colombo this morning that there was a mutiny aboard. Threats had been made to set the vessel afire, the message said.

An hour after the message was received, a party of marines was sent to Trincomalee to embark on the auxiliary steamer Slavov. The Slavov was ordered to go to the Jervis Bay and bring the liner to Colombo.

The British cruiser Enterprise yesterday received a wireless message from the Jervis Bay, which left Adelaide on June 9 for London, stating that the vessel was having trouble with "eight desperate stowaways."

Efforts after 6 a. m. today to communicate with the Jervis Bay failed. It was feared that the vessel was in the hands of mutineers.

The cruiser Enterprise received this wireless message from the Jervis Bay at 2 a. m. today:

"Mutiny. Threatening to set ship afire. Send immediate assistance."

EARTHQUAKES IN MEXICO KEEP UP

EL PASO, Tex., June 21.—(AP)—Earthquakes are reported continuing in the vicinity of Fuxtepec in the state of Oaxaca, Mexico, where 181 shocks have been recorded in the last few days. Chacabua, a seaport town, was totally engulfed when the waves swept inland more than 5,000 yards during the tremors. All houses in Chacabua were destroyed and the inhabitants fled for their lives to the mountains, according to dispatches from Mexico City.

WASHINGTON, June 21.—(AP)—The seismograph at Georgetown university began registering earthquake shocks at 5:56 o'clock today and continued to register four hours. The shocks were of "considerable intensity," reaching their maximum at 6:30 o'clock. The distance away was estimated at "over 7000 miles."

PORTLAND'S NEW PHONE RATES TO BE FOUGHT HARD

PORTLAND, Ore., June 21.—(AP)—Fixing of telephone rates for a period of 25 years, as proposed in the new Pacific Telephone and Telephone company franchise now before the city council, is opposed by Colonel A. E. Clark, chairman of the legislature to investigate telephone rates.

The franchise should provide for a revision of rates at least every five years, he said today in a communication to Commissioner Mann.

"In view of the rapid, constant change in methods, practices and facilities of public service corporations, particularly telephone companies, the practice of granting long term franchises with fixed and inflexible provisions is of doubtful wisdom, especially in a large and growing city like Portland," the communication said.

Provision should be made allowing the city council to make definite demands upon the company and for revision, the letter states. There should also be a declaration that the company considers the new rate schedule as reasonable. This would eliminate a chance of the company going before the public service commission with claims that private reservations had been made to the agreement when it was accepted.
