

BERRIES CHEAP IN SPITE OF THE CANNING SEASON

PORTLAND, Ore., June 21.—(AP) Current canning season is now here and local wholesale markets are well supplied with unusually fine stuff going at \$1.75 per crate. Berries are now at the height of the season with harvests on in earnest. Local stocks were bringing 12 1/2 to 15 cents per pound for King and 8 to 10 cents per pound for Royal Anne. Tartarians and pie cherries of other varieties were bringing at 5 to 7 cents. Strawberries were a shade earlier today reflecting slightly heavier receipts. Best offerings brought \$1.65 to \$1.75 while other varieties sold as low as \$1.50. Loganberries were steady at \$1.50 and raspberries at \$2.25 per crate. Old potatoes were moving well today with most sales of local stock bringing around fifty cents per sack while U. S. No. 1 Deschutes brought out of state sold at \$1.25 per sack. New potatoes were steady at \$2 to 2.75 per cwt. Trading was fairly active on the country dressed meat and poultry markets but prices were steady and unchanged. Receipts were moderate but sufficient to satisfy demand. No changes were quoted in butter and egg prices today.

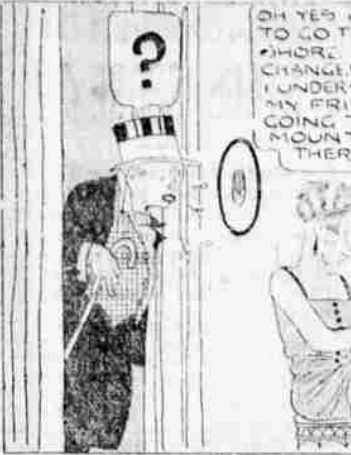

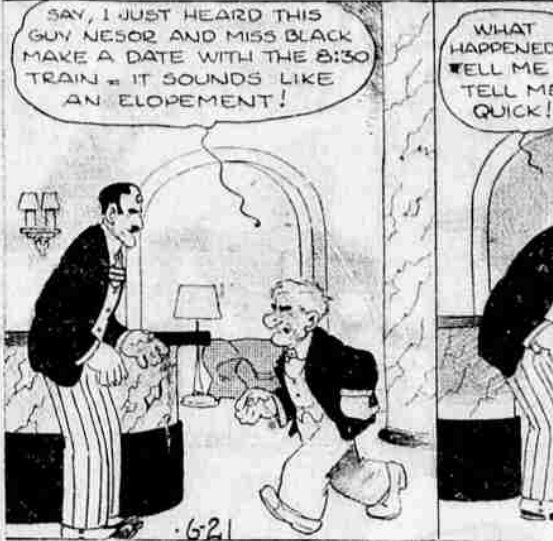
